

Each November, *Kalaa Utsavam – Indian Festival of Arts* by Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay brings together artists and audiences in a spirit of celebration, discovery, and connection. As we enter the 24th edition of the festival, from 21 – 30 Nov 2025, we are reminded of its role as a home for Indian arts in Singapore. It is a space where tradition meets innovation, where stories are shared, and where communities come together.

Guided by four key objectives—to celebrate the excellence of Indian arts and culture, present a festival that balances excitement with artistic merit, foster a stronger youth presence, and develop the next generation of Singapore artists—*Kalaa Utsavam* continues to honour its roots while embracing the future. This year's festival reflects these ideals through a vibrant mix of tradition, innovation, and cross-cultural collaboration.

The festival continues to champion new creations by Singapore artists, with six new works in the line-up this year, including four Esplanade co-productions and one Esplanade commission. *Mission Malligapoo* by inventive theatre-makers **AGAM Theatre Lab** is a playful and heartwarming production, while dynamic music group **SwaRhythm** brings *Samudra*, a captivating new production inspired by the ebb and flow of the ocean. In a bold

meeting of genres, trailblazing metal band **RUDRA** joins forces with the refined musicianship of **Resound Collective** for an unforgettable orchestral experience. Acclaimed Singapore poet **Pooja Nansi** explores love and belonging in the lyrical *We Make Spaces Divine ft. Dey*, and the powerful *Shikhandi* by **SIFAS Productions Ltd** blends the grace of *kathak* with the dynamism of *bharatanatyam*. The genre-bending local Latin jazz fusion band **Project RA** teams up with virtuoso vocalist **Varijashree Venugopal** to weave intricate Carnatic melodies with vibrant jazz improvisation in a performance bursting with rhythmic vitality and soulful depth.

From further afield, legendary poet and lyricist **Javed Akhtar** is set to enchant with *Main Koi Aisa Geet Gaoon*, an intimate evening of words and melodies, while beloved stand-up star **Zakir Khan** returns to Singapore with his trademark warmth, wit, and relatable humour.

Also not to be missed are the visually arresting *Kintsugi* by Canada's renowned **Sampradaya Dance Creations**, multi-instrumentalist **Soumik Datta's** poignant, music-driven reflection on memory and Alzheimer's disease, *Mone Rekho*, and Malaysian hip-hop powerhouse **Rabbit Mac's** high-energy showcase with his friends. Families can delight in the charming *Circle of Life* by **Ranga Shankara's AHA! Theatre for Children**, specially created for children as young as five.

Throughout the festival, we are also delighted to offer many free programmes at Esplanade's public spaces, where audiences can enjoy live music, dance and storytelling. These free programmes not only make the arts more accessible but also allow families, friends, and curious passersby to come together and experience the joy of *Kalaa Utsavam* together.

About Esplanade - Theatres on the Bay

Esplanade is Singapore's national performing arts centre. It hosts a year-round line-up of about 4,000 live performances and activities presented by Esplanade, its partners and hirers. As an arts centre for everyone, Esplanade also creates opportunities for seniors, youth, children and underserved communities to experience the arts. More than 70% of the shows that take place each year at the centre are free for all to enjoy.

Esplanade also brings the arts virtually to audiences in Singapore and beyond, through its diverse range of digital programmes on *Esplanade Offstage*, an all-access backstage pass to the performing arts and guide to Singapore and Asian arts and culture, with videos, podcasts, articles, quizzes and resources.

The centre works in close partnership with local, regional and international artists to develop artistic capabilities and content, push artistic boundaries and engage audiences. Esplanade supports the creation of artistic content by commissioning and producing new Singapore and Asian work for the international stage. It also develops technical capabilities for the industry nationally.

Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay is operated by The Esplanade Co Ltd (TECL), which is a not-for-profit organisation, a registered Charity and an Institution of a Public Character. TECL received the Charity Governance Award – Special Commendation for Clarity of Strategy in 2016 and 2022, the Charity Transparency Award from 2016 – 2023, and the Charity Transparency Dedication Award in 2024. Esplanade is Singapore's first Dementia-Friendly Arts Venue and a certified Dementia Go-To Point, as well as a guide/assistance dog friendly centre.

TECL receives funding support from Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth and its Community Programmes are supported by Tote Board Family, comprising Tote Board, Singapore Pools and Singapore Turf Club.



Each composition blends traditional instruments with contemporary textures, creating a dynamic sonic confluence that celebrates Singapore's multicultural identity through the symbolism of water and live sand art.



About RUDRA

Named after the Indian deity of destruction to symbolise the aggressive nature of their music, RUDRA is a band known for pioneering a new genre: Vedic metal.

Formed in 1992, and initially starting out as a death metal band, RUDRA has evolved to forge a unique sound that blends death and black metal with traditional Indian elements. Their music incorporates Sanskrit chants, mantras and traditional Indian music, creating a powerful bridge between Eastern and Western influences. Their innovative approach and dynamic performances have established them as a force in the global metal scene, garnering a dedicated fanbase worldwide.

About Resound Collective

Since its debut in 2016, Resound has firmly established itself as the finest conductorless chamber orchestra in Singapore, dedicated to the highest artistic standards of excellence and leadership in chamber music.

Led by Artistic Director Mervin Beng and Associate Artistic Director / Concertmaster Yang Shuxiang, Resound prides itself in bringing to life masterpieces ranging from baroque and classical to music of the future, delivering each work with purpose and passion. The orchestra comprises Singapore's exceptional classical musicians, with a core of 21 musicians who pursue parallel careers as performers and educators.

Guest soloists who have performed with Resound include pianist Stephen Hough, trumpeter Tine Thing Helseth, violinist Keila Wakao, cellist Qin Li-Wei and toy pianist Margaret Leng Tan.

The orchestra has also performed, commissioned, and premiered works by Singaporean composers such as Jonathan Shin, Eric Watson and Tan Chan Boon.

The orchestra's versatility has attracted various collaborators, making Resound and its musicians their orchestra of choice. Highlights of the 2025 season include the world premiere of a work by British composer Jonathan Dove, playing in the Singapore leg of Sigur Rós' 2025 Orchestral World Tour, as well as working with American conductor-composer Arnie Roth to present works from the *Final Fantasy* series in concert.

Zakir Khan is one of India's most beloved comedians, known for his poetic storytelling, heartfelt anecdotes, and unmatched relatability. A college dropout from Indore, he broke into a predominantly English comedy scene using Hindi as his comedic medium, making his

rise both unlikely and iconic. His catchphrases, like "Sakht Launda" have become part of pop culture, earning him over 830 million YouTube views and a massive global fanbase.

Zakir made history as the first Asian comedian to headline and sell out London's Royal Albert Hall and is now set to become the first to perform in Hindi at NYC's Madison Square Garden and Toronto's Scotiabank Arena during his 2025 North America tour.

With five Amazon Prime specials—including *Tathastu* and *Haq Se Single*—Zakir has redefined Indian comedy and continues to represent India on the world's biggest stages.

About AGAM Theatre Lab

AGAM Theatre Lab (AGAM) is a young Singaporean Tamil theatre company dedicated to creating a sustainable platform for Tamil theatre within Singapore's vibrant arts landscape. Established in January 2019, AGAM has grown exponentially, producing trailblazing works that continually invigorate and enhance the presence of Tamil theatre in the local arts scene. Accorded with charity status and an accredited Institute of Public Character (IPC), AGAM became the first Tamil theatre company recognised under the Major company scheme under the National Arts Council.

Over the past years, AGAM has not only produced traditional Tamil theatre works but has also innovated new forms of production and direction, pushing the boundaries of Tamil theatrical expression. The company has undertaken various initiatives to nurture and support young and aspiring artists, fostering the growth and development of talents within the community. Its work is characterised by its commitment to nurturing emerging talents, supporting new writing, and creating platforms for underrepresented voices.

At the core of AGAM's work is the aspiration to create professional plays of the highest quality for contemporary audiences. Despite being a relatively young theatre company, AGAM's core team possesses a wealth of experience spanning organisational management and theatre-making, driving its remarkable success over the past five years. AGAM has successfully collaborated with various arts organisations, including Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay, and has received recognition for its contributions, including the ST Life! Theatre Awards.

About Subramanian Ganesh, Director

Subramanian Ganesh is a multi-disciplinary theatre-maker whose two-decade journey in the performing arts spans directing, acting, and lighting design. In 2019, he founded Agam Theatre Lab with a bold vision to reimagine Tamil theatre—anchored in heritage yet fearless in form. Under his leadership, Agam has become a trailblazer in Singapore's theatre scene, known for its bilingual productions, VR/AR integrations, and commitment to developing new artistic voices.

Ganesh's directorial work reflects both range and ambition: from classic adaptations like *Othello* and the cult comedy *Adukku Veettu Annasamy*, to the Tarantino-inspired *Kullanari* and biographical tribute *Re.Somma*, to large-scale epics such as *Murasu*, a reimagining of *Animal Farm* in *Vilangu Pannai*, and the award-winning dark comedy *Twin Murder in Green Mansion*.

In 2024, Ganesh was nominated for Best Director at the ST Life! Theatre Awards, a landmark moment in Tamil theatre that affirmed his position as a defining voice in contemporary Singapore theatre. With a practice rooted in collaboration, innovation, and cultural depth, he continues to shape a bold, inclusive, and future-facing Tamil theatre landscape.

About Karthikeyan Somasundaram, Director and Playwright

Karthikeyan Somasundaram is a theatre actor, director, and writer prominent in Tamil theatre. He has written and directed acclaimed plays like *Pachae Bungalaa Rettae Kolaedaa* (PBRK), *Vilangu Pannai*, *Re Somma*, and *Adukku Veettu Annasamy 2*. His work on PBRK, in which he also performed, earned a Best Director nomination at the 2024 STLife! Theatre Awards, a nomination for Best Set Design, and a win for Best Ensemble.

As an actor, he has starred in Tamil plays such as *Re Somma*, *Azhagiya Asuran*, *Othello*, and *Murasu*. Holding a First Class Honours BA in Acting from Lasalle College of the Arts, he has performed in English productions including Shakespeare's *Henry IV*, *Requiem for Change*, *Medusa*, and *Pinter's Trilogy*, working with renowned directors.

Over the years, he has won multiple awards at Mediacorp's Pradhana Vizha award ceremony: twice for Best Actor, thrice for Best Infotainment Host, once for Best Scriptwriter, and in 2025, Most Favourite Artist.

About Syed Ashratullah, Playwright

Syed is a writer for theatre, television and radio, as well as an actor and educator with over a decade of experience. He has collaborated with Agam Theatre Lab, Avant Theatre & Language, and Singapore Indian Theatre & Film Explorers (SITFE). His writing and acting credits including *Vizhuthugal* (*Roots*), *Vithai*, *Thuyil*, *Bluetick* and *Tharuthalai Thirutham*. In 2021, he received the Kaviyarasu Kannadasan Award for his contributions to Tamil language and performing arts.





Born in India and raised in London, Soumik Datta rose to prominence as a master of the *sarod*, performing alongside a diverse array of artists including Anoushka Shankar, Jay-Z, Bill Bailey and Beyoncé. A composition graduate from London's Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance, he lists Radiohead, M.I.A., Gustavo Santaolalla, Ustad Zair Hussain, Shakti, Akram Khan Company, Complicité and Gecko Theatre among his influences and inspirations.

His recent works feature new collaborators in cinematic projects that draw on concepts of identity, memory, and shared human experience.

Datta has a long-standing association with the Southbank Centre, having first performed there as a teenager, accompanying his guru, Pandit Buddhadev Das Gupta. Notable appearances include headlining a performance at the Queen Elizabeth Hall as part of Alchemy Festival and, in 2022, the premiere of his piece *Happy Notes* at the same venue.

In 2023, Datta began working on a trilogy addressing memory, migration and climate change, for which he spent much of his residency at Southbank Centre Studio developing. We Make Spaces Divine ft. Dey, is a live performance that draws on the worlds that raised us: Rajinikanth's cigarette-flick swagger alongside Amitabh's baritone thunder, A. R. Rahman's hooks that leap across languages, the soundtracks of Sunday afternoon films, the injustice of headlines made at Komala Vilas, and the pulse of Mustafa Centre past midnight.

This collaboration brings together poets Pooja Nansi and Shivram Gopinath, guitarist Isuru Wijesoma, and DJ Raaj. Named after Nansi's poetry collection—shortlisted for the Singapore Literature Prize and listed among the "50 greatest works of Sing Lit" by *The Straits Times*—this new iteration collides Pooja's poems with Shivram's new work *Dey*, Isuru's blistering guitar work and Raaj's crate-dug, brown-futurist beats.

We Make Spaces Divine ft. Dey, unfolds as spoken word meets club night—a celebration of the cinematic, complicated, messy, and glorious textures of growing up in the cities we love. It is an invitation to listen, dance, heal and reimagine belonging together.

About Pooja Nansi

Pooja Nansi is a poet and educator who believes in the power that performance can lend to the written word. She has published three poetry collections: *Stiletto Scars* (2007), *Love is An Empty Barstool* (2013) and *We Make Spaces Divine* (2021). She also co-edited *SingPoWriMo: The Anthology* (2014), and co-authored *Local Anaesthetic: a Painless Approach to Singaporean Poetry* (2014), a teacher's resource for Singaporean poetry. She has over 15 years of experience in secondary and higher tertiary education across Literature and Creative Writing.

Her key performance work includes her recurring one-woman show, *You Are Here*, which explores issues of migration through personal family histories. It opened in Singapore in 2015 and has since seen five iterations and toured to Australia. She also wrote and performed *Thick Beats for Good Girls* with Checkpoint Theatre which opened in April 2018 and explored the intersections between feminism, identity and hip hop.

From April 2013 to February 2018, she curated a monthly spoken word and poetry event called Speakeasy at Artistry, which showcased both emerging and established poets from Singapore and beyond, including Burma and Botswana. In December 2018, she co-founded the minority voices festival Other Tongues as a Youth Poet Ambassador Public Programme.
