Dear friends of the media,

How do children see themselves and the community that supports them? How do they develop the strength to face challenges and difficulties? What is a safe space or environment to a child, and how is the community a part of it?

These are some of the questions we hope to explore during *March On 2023*, Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay's annual arts festival for young audiences and their families. Taking place from 9 - 19 Mar 2023 over the school holidays, this year's festival will feature three commissioned works that take on the theme of identity and how children navigate their environment.

In the Esplanade Theatre, *The Beginning of Everything* follows the story of six-year-old Shan and her explorations of a new world—school. This is the third work in a series of commissions directed by Edith Podesta for *March On* and this year, she is joined by playwright Michelle Tan. The work hopes to be a companion for children to find the courage and empower them with tools to cope with unfamiliar situations and new environments. The play draws from images and drawings shared by children in Singapore through organised workshops, and invites children and adults to have a conversation about their own fears of growing up and navigating identity. *Changeling* by Void Deck Games—an updated version of *Monster Hunt*

presented in 2022—returns to the Esplanade Annexe Studio, this time with a LARP (Live Action Role Playing) experience for those eight and up.

The third commissioned work is **Come Back Home**, a two-year distance-based collaboration between Australian and Singaporean artists, featuring renowned children's theatre company from Australia, Polyglot Theatre. Directed by Sue Giles, *Come Back Home* is a participatory and immersive experience for children and intergenerational audiences. Inspired by the community usage of HDB void decks in Singapore, this performance will take place at the Singtel Waterfront Theatre at Esplanade where participants will follow the story of a lost child.

We are also excited to welcome and introduce Second Hand Dance Company from UK to Singapore audiences with the presentation of *We Dance, We Play, We Touch*, an interactive dance experience for young families.

March On also continues to strive to create space to support a child's support network, as well as room for ideation and feedback for artistic practices. Throughout the festival, there will be workshops for children, families and caregivers conducted by Somayoke and Artfold. We are continuing our partnership with ASSSITEJ Singapore to put together professional development and industry-based discussions for educators and artists. Children-led activities and programmes under the *Seedlings* initiative as well as well-loved Tak Takut Kids Club, alongside a whole host of free music, dance and story-telling programmes for children are a key part of the festival too. And finally, we would like to thank our Principal Sponsor Naturel for their generous support of *March On 2023*.

While this is the third edition of *March On*, we have only just begun our journey. There is much work to do for our children and we march on with tenacity and hopeful hearts. We hope that schools as well as young audiences and their families will be able to take away a memory, lesson or meaningful conversation from the festival.

Esplanade –Theatres on the Bay is operated by The Esplanade Co Ltd (TECL), which is a not-for-profit organisation, a registered Charity and an Institution of a Public Character. The Charity Council awarded TECL the Charity Governance Award – Special Commendation for Clarity of Strategy in 2016 and 2022, and the Charity Transparency Award from 2016 – 2019 and 2022. Esplanade is Singapore's first Dementia-Friendly Arts Venue and a certified Dementia Go-To Point, as well as a Guide-dog Friendly centre.

TECL receives funding support from Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth and its Community Programmes are supported by Tote Board Family, comprising Tote Board, Singapore Pools and Singapore Turf Club.

A call from above: come back home!

The cats know. The crow knows. The Karung Guni knows... There's someone missing.

Through stories and play, soon everyone will know who is hiding, who is lost and who is found.

Come Back Home is a tale that winds through the past and the present to seek out a child who went missing a long time ago. Immersive and theatrical, it draws on the experience of children and adult memories of being a child, to celebrate possibility, place and imagination.

Audiences will be invited to participate in the action as the story unfolds, taking their place in the activity of a vibrant community. When booking, families can choose to be in the seated auditorium (Observer) or on stage (Participant) amidst the adventure.

Come Back Home by Polyglot Theatre is an Esplanade Commission, co-produced by Polyglot Theatre (Australia) and Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay (Singapore) in collaboration with artists in both countries.

Come Back Home was developed through a collaborative process of creation at a distance. Beginning in 2021, artists from Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay and Polyglot Theatre worked together to make a new, participatory experience for and with children.

In this creative experiment, the artists collaborated via remote digital connection and play: sharing skills, stimulating ideas and becoming a creative team. Collaboration with children took place in each country throughout the process.

"Kiap" (Hokkien): act of squeezing or gripping an object; colloquial reference to the giant tongs in claw machines; a connection between people.

Tak Takut Kids Club (TTKC), a child-centric community arts centre, is often inundated with well-meaning donations of toys and dolls that the children don't actually *need*. Visual artist, Jimmy Ong, responded by spending time with the children during his residency at TTKC to manually deconstruct and re-construct the toys and dolls; rediscovering, in the process, matters like charitable giving, social dynamics and the environment. This participatory art showcase invites children and adults to spend time together to re-imagine, re-order and re-connect as a larger community.

This project is co-created by visual artist Jimmy Ong and the community at Tak Takut Kids Club (TTKC), a children's and youth centre in Boon Lay Drive initiated by 3Pumpkins, a socially engaged arts organisation. Through innovative outreach and development programmes that use collaborative and participatory approaches, TTKC aims to build and provide a happier and safer environment for young persons in vulnerable circumstances to develop and grow. 3Pumpkins is a key partner of Comlink @Jurong West in the exploration of upstream interventions in integrated social support.
