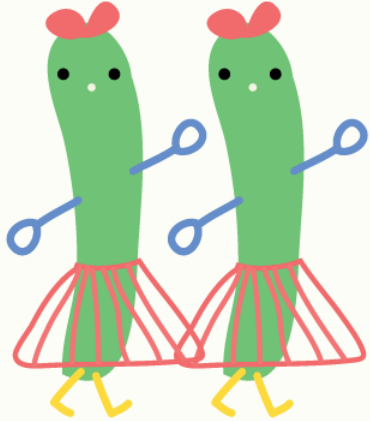

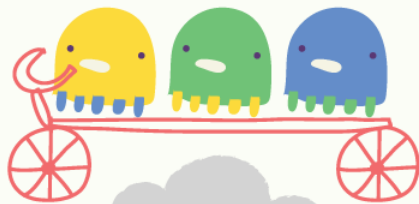

The theatre

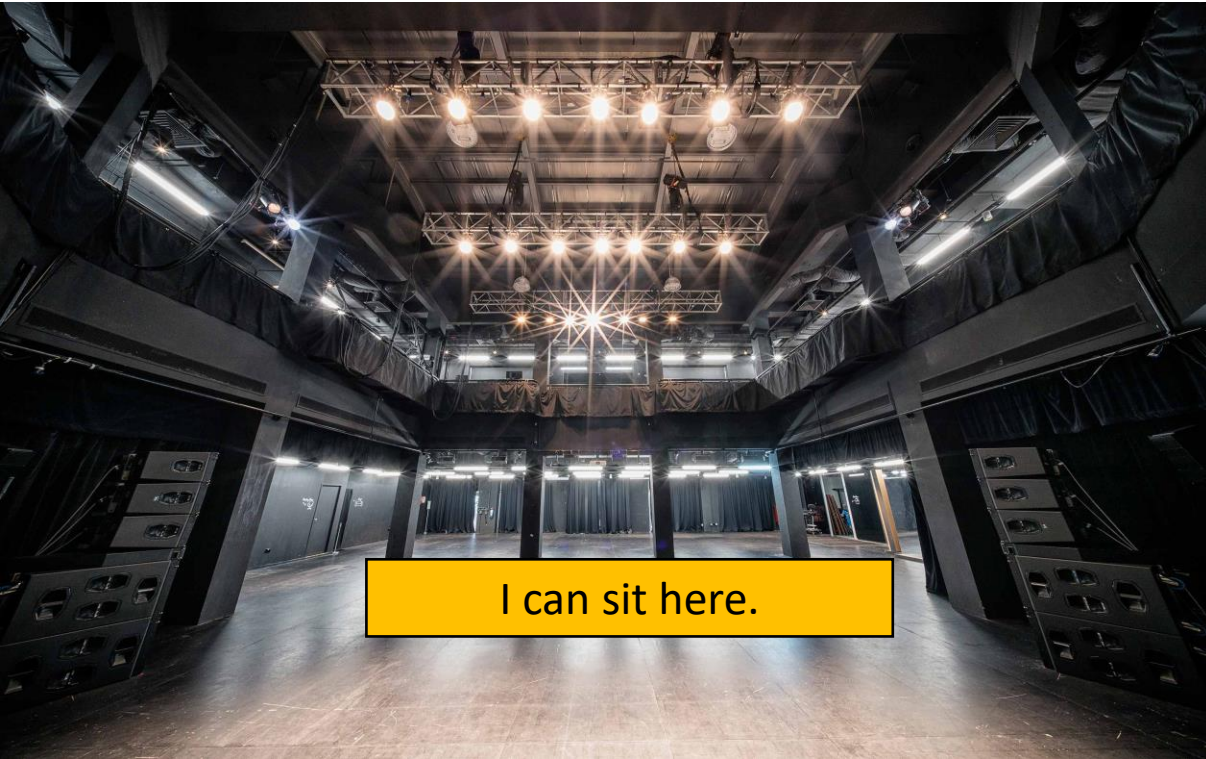


This is the theatre the show will be in.

A theatre is a room where a show takes place.

The theatre will be a little dark. Some lights will be turned on to help me see.

Where to sit



When I am in the theatre, an usher will show me where to sit.

I can sit on the floor or ask an usher for a chair.

Moving about



If I want to move or dance **on the spot** during the show, that is okay.

If I need to go to the toilet during the show, that is okay.

An adult or an usher can show me the way to the toilet.

A quieter place



Sometimes, I want to leave my seat when the show is happening and look for a quiet place anywhere in Esplanade. I can do that.

I can go back to my seat in the theatre anytime when I am ready.

Performer



A performer is someone who we watch or listen to in a show.

Performers can act, sing, dance and play musical instruments—sometimes all at the same time!

I will see these performers in the show.

This is Bernice. She is performing the role of B.

B loves how she can move in different ways to show what she is feeling and thinking.



Zhuo Zihao

This is Zihao. He is performing the role of Z.

Z is shy and finds it difficult to express himself.

He admires B and hopes he can be more confident like her.

Movement

B and Z prefer to move their body to express what they think and feel than to use words.

They are often silent.



Discussion

When the show ends, I can share with everyone what I think about the show.

I can ask an usher for a microphone so that everyone can hear me. I can also speak without a microphone. I can also ask an adult for help to repeat what I said so that everyone else can hear me.
