

Esplanade is Singapore's national performing arts centre. It hosts a year-round line-up of about 3,500 live performances and activities presented by Esplanade, its partners and hirers. Esplanade also brings the arts virtually to audiences in Singapore and beyond, through its diverse range of digital programmes on Esplanade Offstage, an all-access backstage pass to the performing arts and guide to Singapore and Asian arts and culture, with videos, podcasts, articles, guizzes and resources.

As an arts centre for everyone, Esplanade also creates opportunities for seniors, youth, children and underserved communities to experience the arts. More than 70% of the shows that take place each year at the centre are free for all to enjoy.

The centre works in close partnership with local, regional and international artists to develop artistic capabilities and content, push artistic boundaries and engage audiences. Esplanade supports the creation of artistic content by commissioning and producing new Singapore and Asian work for the international stage. It also develops technical capabilities for the industry nationally.

Turning 20 in 2022, Esplanade marks the occasion with a year-long celebration themed 20 and Beyond: Keeping the Lights On. In addition to the presentations of its year-long festivals, programme series, and special initiatives and events, there will also be a season of new works by Singapore and Asian artists specially commissioned for the arts centre's 20th anniversary and official opening of its newest venue, Singtel Waterfront Theatre.

Esplanade - Theatres on the Bay is operated by The Esplanade Co Ltd (TECL), which is a not-for-profit organisation, a registered Charity and an Institution of a Public Character. The Charity Council awarded TECL the Charity Governance Award – Special Commendation for Clarity of Strategy in 2016, and the Charity Transparency Award for four consecutive years since 2016. Esplanade is Singapore's first Dementia-Friendly Arts Venue and a certified Dementia Go-To Point, as well as a Guide-dog Friendly centre.

TECL receives funding support from Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth and its Community Programmes are supported by Tote Board Family, comprising Tote Board, Singapore Pools and Singapore Turf Club.

# **Andy Chia**

Andy is a producer, director, artist, musician, husband, and father.

He was the first professionally trained Chinese flutist in Singapore and the first non-native Chinese to receive an MA in Dizi performance from the Shanghai Conservatory of Music as a National Arts Council scholar, Andy is also the co-founder, artistic director, producer, and resident artist SAtheCollective Ltd.

Andy's artistic pursuit is in the exploration of the evolving relationship between humans, nature, and technology. His study uses shamanic and ritualistic teachings alongside interdisciplinary and intercultural manners in search of a harmonious, unified existence between all three entities on the planet we call home. His art has been described as hypermodernism, drawing from ethnic roots while still remaining contemporary.

As an artist and producer, Andy has commissioned been by and/or worked with major festivals and institutions such as Singapore International Festival of Arts, National Gallery Singapore, Singapore Chinese Cultural Centre, as well as OZAsia Festival (Australia), Sydney Festival. and AngelicA Festival Internazionale di Musica (Bologna).

His latest works include SIFA X: Oneirism (SIFA 2022), and Poetic interdisciplinary exhibition Pandemic.

#### **Azrin Abdullah**

Azrin started learning the acoustic guitar at the age of six, gave his first musical performance by the time he was nine, and hasn't looked back since.

His love affair with the *oud* began in 1999, when he was tasked to learn it as part of an endeavour to master traditional Malay music. Although he has faced considerable challenges and difficulties in learning to play this instrument, Azrin continues to believe in sharing his knowledge so that the *oud* can be made accessible to all.

In 2014, Azrin was sponsored by the National Arts Council to pursue an advanced course at the National Conservatory of Arts in Kuala Lumpur to further his knowledge of the oud. In 2016, he produced the first Singapore Gambus Conference in conjunction with the Malay Culture Festival at the Malay Heritage Centre, gathering local and international speakers and gambus enthusiasts to share their knowledge of the instrument.

Azrin was instrumental in forming Singapore Oudists (SGOudists), an online oud community that provides local players from all walks of life with a platform to get together and share techniques and playing styles.

He is currently an adjunct teacher with School of The Arts (SOTA) and also President of the Oudists Association of Singapore.

Her solo composition Hejira was used in the closing credits of Singaporean filmmaker Yeo Siew Hua's award-winning film, A Land Imagined.

In the same year, the now-dissolved arts collective he co-founded, Kill Your Television (KYTV), was awarded the Japanese Chamber of Commerce & Industry (JCCI) Singapore Foundation Arts Award. Rizman has performed locally and internationally and at the inaugural Singapore Biennale in 2006.

Rizman is one half of the retro-futurist electronic duo NADA and is currently an Associate Artist with Cake Theatrical Productions.

weish is a composer, vocalist, writer, performer, and artist whose work spans diverse genres and disciplines. She is part of electronic duo .gif, prog group sub:shaman, and audiovisual collective and label Syndicate.

As a musician, weish has performed on stages including the F1 Grand Prix, as opening act for Canadian duo Tegan and Sara at the Esplanade Concert Hall, St Jerome's Laneway Festival. Soundsfair Jakarta, BIGSOUND Australia, Neon Lights, and the Golden Melody Awards Taipei. In 2018, she performed at Sundance Film Festival the Sheffield Doc/Fest, having written the theme song and part of the soundtrack of Sundance award-winning film, Shirkers by Sandi Tan.

A regular collaborator and associate artist with Checkpoint Theatre, weish was musical director for the theatre company's Displaced Persons' Welcome Dinner (SIFA 2019), and wrote and performed original script and music in Be Here, With Me as part of their digital festival, Two Songs and a Story (2020). weish also wrote and performed Besides Ourselves presented by .qif Singapore Fringe Festival 2020), and Did You Want More Sleep? (SIFA 2020–2021).

weish has also transformed plants into instruments for Vogue Singapore and Playtronica, composed for a dance film by T.H.E Dance Company, and created *A Taxi Uncle Symphony*, a sound-art film commissioned by and exhibited at National Gallery Singapore.

#### **Nova Ruth**

Nova Ruth Setyaningtyas is a Java neo-soul musician and an artivist. As co-founder and emcee of the female duo Twinsista, she has explored genres ranging from jazz, R&B, noise and post-folk for over ten years before finally meeting Filastine, her longest music partner.

She co-created Arka Kinari—a sailing vessel and floating arts platform sounding the alarm on climate change, while carrying culture as its cargo. Combining method and message, the ship voyages through Indonesian waters to raise awareness among remote coastal communities about climate change through a floating audio-visual performance powered by renewable energy.

Reviving the involvement of female sailors in Indonesia, Nova has brought on women art workers to join a residency programme onboard Arka Kinari in collaboration with Peretas. Her focus on ocean subjects got her invited to become one of the founders of The Women Of The Seven Seas. From starting out as a naive artist who had a fear of the ocean, after clocking thousands nautical miles and three years as a liveaboard, she might now be able to call herself a sailor.

Nova has brought the waves of Java onto international world stages such as the Incubate Festival (Netherlands), Downtown Cairo Arts (Egypt), Indonesian Dance Festival (Indonesia), Les Vieilles Charrues (France), and Mona Foma (Australia). She was co-composer for xhe, a durational dance piece directed by Daniel Kok and Miho Shimizu presented by Esplanade's da:ns festival and at Liveworks in Svdnev (2018): Postcolonial Spirits by Choy Ka Fai for Indonesia Bertutur (2022): Liminality. а full dome performance produced by 4PI for SAT Montreal (2019); and the Arka Kinari Live Documentary for CULTVR Cardiff and Full Dome UK in Plymouth (2022).



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


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
