It hosts a year-round line-up of about 3,500 live performances and activities presented by Esplanade, its partners and hirers. As an arts centre for everyone, Esplanade also creates opportunities for seniors, youth, children and underserved communities to experience the arts. More than 70% of the shows that take place each year at the centre are free for all to enjoy.

Esplanade also brings the arts virtually to audiences in Singapore and beyond, through its diverse range of digital programmes on *Esplanade Offstage*, an all-access backstage pass to the performing arts and guide to Singapore and Asian arts and culture, with videos, podcasts, articles, quizzes and resources.

The centre works in close partnership with local, regional and international artists to develop artistic capabilities and content, push artistic boundaries and engage audiences. Esplanade supports the creation of artistic content by commissioning and producing new Singapore and Asian work for the international stage. It also develops technical capabilities for the industry nationally.

Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay is operated by The Esplanade Co Ltd (TECL), which is a not-for-profit organisation, a registered Charity and an Institution of a Public Character. The Charity Council awarded TECL the Charity Governance Award – Special Commendation for Clarity of Strategy in 2016 and 2022, and the Charity Transparency Award from 2016 – 2019 and 2022. Esplanade is Singapore's first Dementia-Friendly Arts Venue and a certified Dementia Go-To Point, as well as a Guide-dog Friendly centre.

TECL receives funding support from Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth and its Community Programmes are supported by Tote Board Family, comprising Tote Board, Singapore Pools and Singapore Turf Club.

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

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## CHOREOGRAPHER'S MESSAGE

For me, the value of dance goes beyond its physical experience. It is a ritual which connects our inner world with our socio-political and cultural reality. As a choreographer, I am taking movement and action in consideration within the whole context of a live space, as well as the detail of in between spaces. My interests lies with the significance of one's mental experience, delivered within the moving constellation of energy.

Lapse is one of my ongoing research projects which approaches the particularity of space between the human body and the non-human presence. By re-questioning the potentialities of chaos as a state of collective energy, Lapse is a shared moment which will bring us to the language of rasa, and our mindful senses.

#### Melati Suryodarmo

#### **SYNOPSIS**

Known for her bold, durational solo performances, acclaimed Indonesian visual and performance artist Melati Suryodarmo premieres *Lapse*, a new dance creation performed by collaborators from Indonesia, Taiwan and Singapore.

First released as two short films, this iteration marks the live performance premiere of *Lapse*. Here Suryodarmo dives into the metamorphic constellation of body and environment through evocative, visceral imagery suspended in factual absurdity. With sound design and live music by Yuen Chee Wai from Singapore music collective The Observatory, Suryodarmo orchestrates movement patterns that steer the group of performers to connect by failures while collectively attempting a new structure and alchemy of senses.



Drawing inspiration from by-products of chaos and situations that represent a gradual decline in the efficiency, stability, and overall functioning of society, *Lapse* signifies a transition from a state of order and coherence to one of disorder and confusion. Within this deep-rooted turbulence, Suryodarmo points to the symptomatic nature of systemic breakdowns, ethical decline and societal disillusionment of our time. While lapses in society begin to manifest through the decay of behaviour, diminishing social cohesion, ruptured institutions and the disintegration of moral frameworks, the work investigates the unpredictable space between reality and a vision of collective commitment towards change.

This production is presented as part of da:ns focus – Connect Asia Now (CAN), a weekend that spotlights contemporary dance works by Asian artists focusing on distinct voices and creative impulses from the region.

## Artist Melati Suryodarmo

Melati Suryodarmo (b. 1969, Solo, Indonesia) graduated from the Hochschule für Bildende Künste Braunscheweig, Germany. Her practice is informed by Japanese *butoh*, dance and history, among others. Her work is the result of ongoing research in the movements of the body and its

relationship to the self and the world. These are translated into photography, dance choreography, video and live performances. Suryodarmo has presented her works in locations all over the world, including Kiasma, Helsinki, Finland; MMCA, Gwacheon, South Korea; National Art Centre Tokyo, Tokyo, Japan; Para Site, Hong Kong; QAGOMA, Australia; and Singapore Art Museum. She has presented her choreographic pieces in various festivals, including at TPAM, BankArt, Yokohama (2016) Witch Dance Festival, Sophien Saele, Berlin (2016); Europalia Festival at KVS Brussels (2017); De Singel, Anwerp; Frankfurt LAB, Frankfurt (2015) and Indonesia Dance Festival, Jakarta Theatre, (2016).

In 2019, she created *Orfeus* a dance piece based on Goenawan Mohamad's poetry, performed at Salihara Jakarta. In December 2019, she directed and choreographed *Opera Gandari*, an opera composed by Tony Prabowo at Graha Bakti Budaya, Jakarta Art Centre, Taman Ismail Marzuki, Jakarta. Since 2007, Suryodarmo has been organising PALA and Undisclosed Territory, both annual performance art

festivals, in Solo, Indonesia. In 2012, she founded Studio Plesungan, an art space for performance artists. She was the Artistic Director of the Jakarta Biennale 2017, and since 2021 she has been working as Artistic Director of the Indonesia Bertutur, the art and culture festival presented by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia.



## Performer and Rehearsal Coach Razan Wirjosandjojo

Razan Wirjosandjojo completed his studies at the Dance Department, Indonesia Institute of the Arts, Surakarta in 2022. He began forming his artistic practice in dance by learning various disciplines from different spaces and communities in Jakarta from 2010 to 2017. Since moving to Solo in 2018, he

has been learning dance, performance, and visual art with Melati Suryodarmo. Through this intensive engagement with Suryodarmo, he has broadened his perspective on the arts and brought these influences into his artistic practice in both performance and visual work. His choreographed works have been presented at On Stage (Solo, 2021), Imajitari Dance Film Festival (Jakarta, 2021), Galeri Nasional (Jakarta, 2022), Indonesia Bertutur (Borobudur, 2022), STRE@M (Singapore/Korea, 2022), and more. Currently, Razan is an active student and part-time staff of Studio Plesungan.



## Performer Lai Yu-Feng

Born in Chiayi, Taiwan, Lai Yu-Feng is currently majoring in choreography at the Institute of Dance, Taipei University of the Arts. Continuously exploring the authenticity of dance, he has been actively engaging in dialogue with virtual art and hopes to define a creative language and direction that combines

dance, people, and technology. Yu-Feng's choreographed works have been featured at Chiayi New Style Choreography and Dance in Asia 2018 organised by Century Contemporary Dance Company. He has also explored mediums such as painting, video and performance art through collaborations with independent artists Liou Sin-Yi (Sound Line), and Melati Suryodarmo (Lapse). With Century Contemporary Dance Company, he has performed Yao Shu-Fen's Les Noces/Le Sacre Du Printemps, Wings of Desire, The age of silence, Far-Near, and The Chronicle of Silence as well as Chen Wei-Ning's The Present and Rouge.



## Performer Mekratingrum Hapsari

Mekratingrum Hapsari lives and works in Surakarta. She is a dancer and choreographer trained in hip hop, contemporary dance and traditional dance. Her choreographed works include *Daring* (2018), *Thank You* (2021), *A Day to Remember* (2021), and a dance film *Satu Garis Menurun* (2021).

Hapsari has participated in several local and international dance platforms, including a residency at La Biennale Collage Danza in Venice 2018, where she performed works by Marie Chouinard, director of the 2018 Biennale College Danza, and Daina Ashbee from Canada. She has also performed in works by Melati Suryodarmo, Garin Nugroho, Otniel Tasman, and Ari Rudenko. From 2021 to 2022, Hapsari participated in *Bodies of Care*, a project led by LIGNA (Hamburg) and supported by the Goethe Institute Indonesia and Sasikirana Bandung. In 2023, she participated in The Paper Bird Project, supported by the British Council Indonesia and the Padepokan Seni Bagong Kussudiardja (PSBK).



Performer Gabriela Hasianna

Gabriela Hasianna received her degree from the Department of Dance, Institut Seni Indonesia Surakarta in 2023. In 2015, she was part of the dance group Litlee, based in Bogor. In 2018, Gabriela started learning Javanese classical dance and contemporary dance. She has been participating in Melati

Suryodarmo's intensive class at Studio Plesungan since 2021. Some works she has created include: *Obsesi* (2021) and *Reception* (2022). As a dancer, Gabriela has participated in productions including *Mighty Indonesia* (2020) by Eko Supriyanto, *Arah* (2020) and *PULANG* (2021) by Menthari Ashia, *Nyorog* (2021) and *Waktu Ku Kecil*, *Tidak Besar* (2023) by Annastasya Verina, and *Ruwatan Bumi* (Indonesia Bertutur, 2022).



## Sound Designer and Musician Yuen Chee Wai

Yuen Chee Wai (Singapore) is a musician, artist, designer, and curator. Often inspired by perspectives glimpsed through the filmic eye and photographic lens, Yuen's stylistic oeuvre in improvised music is marked by internalised reflections on memory and loss, invisibility, and indeterminacy.

His latest research interests revolve around mycology and caves.

In 2008, together with Otomo Yoshihide (Japan), Ryu Hankil (South Korea), and Yan Jun (China), he formed FEN (Far East Network), an improvised music quartet focusing on the multifaceted networks and collaborations between musicians and artists in Asian countries.

He is also a member of The Observatory, in which he plays guitar, synth and electronics. He tours extensively with FEN and The Observatory, and has presented at MIMI Festival, Lausanne Underground Music and Film Festival, All Ears Festival, Ftarri Festival, Gwangju Biennale and CTM Festival.



Lighting Designer

Adrian Tan

Since graduating from the LASALLE College of the Arts in 2006, Adrian has been designing shows that have been staged locally and internationally. His work spans a wide spectrum of the performing arts and outdoor light installations.

As one of Singapore's most sought-after lighting designers, he has worked extensively across various disciplines in performing arts, and more recently ventured into architectural design and installations. He has also had the opportunity to work on multi-disciplinary entertainment projects such as collaborations with Disney for Star Wars May the Fourth Festival. A collaboration with the UK's prominent landscape artist Tom Massey for the Singapore Garden Festival 2018 also led to a win in the Best Indoor Lighting Award during the festival.

Several of his theatre works have received theatre awards, including shows like *Monkey Goes West* and *Another Country* by Wild Rice, *A Cage Goes In Search Of a Bird* by A Group Of People, *BITCH* for M1 Fringe Festival and *Dark Room*, which was commissioned by Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay.
