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About Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay

Esplanade is Singapore's national performing arts centre and one of the busiest arts centres in the world. Since its opening in 2002, the centre has presented more than 53,000 performances and activities, drawing an audience of 34 million patrons and 116 million visitors. This architectural icon, with its distinctive twin shells, houses world-class performance spaces complemented by a comprehensive range of professional support services.

Esplanade's vision is to be a performing arts centre for everyone and its programming is guided by its social mission—to entertain, engage, educate and inspire. It seeks to enrich everyone's lives, including seniors, youth, children and underserved communities, through the arts. The centre's year-long calendar of about 3,500 arts performances and activities span different cultures, languages and genres including dance, music, theatre, and more. Of these, more than 70% are presented free for all to enjoy. Esplanade's visual arts programmes at its public spaces also allow visitors to view and explore art works for free.

Esplanade also brings the arts virtually to audiences in Singapore and beyond, through its diverse range of digital programmes on *Esplanade Offstage*, an all-access backstage pass to the performing arts and guide to Singapore and Asian arts and culture, with videos, podcasts, articles, quizzes and resources.

Esplanade regularly presents world-renowned companies and artists that attract international attention and add to Singapore's cultural vibrancy. The centre is also a popular performance home for arts groups and commercial presenters who hire its venues to stage a wide range of programmes. These carefully curated presentations complement Esplanade's own diverse offerings for audiences.

Esplanade works in close partnership with local, regional and international artists to develop artistic capabilities, push artistic boundaries and engage audiences. The centre supports the creation of artistic content by commissioning and producing new Singapore and Asian work for the international stage. As an Approved Training Organisation (ATO) of the SkillsFuture Singapore (SSG), Esplanade conducts a range of courses that develops technical capabilities for the industry nationally.

Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay is operated by The Esplanade Co Ltd (TECL), which is a not-for-profit organisation, a registered Charity and an Institution of a Public Character. The Charity Council awarded TECL the Charity Governance Award – Special Commendation for Clarity of Strategy in 2016 and 2022, and the Charity Transparency Award from 2016 – 2019 and 2022. Esplanade is Singapore's first Dementia-Friendly Arts Venue and a certified Dementia Go-To Point, as well as a Guide-dog Friendly centre.

TECL receives funding support from Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth and its Community Programmes are supported by Tote Board Family, comprising Tote Board, Singapore Pools and Singapore Turf Club.

SOLO, which is also known as ORAY AAL in Tamil, is a bilingual (English and Tamil) monologue showcase. Following the success of *SOLO/ORAY AAL* in 2021, S.I.T.F.E is very honoured and thankful to have gotten the support of veterans in the arts industry and newer collaborators. Alvin Tan, T. Sasitharan, Yeo Hon Beng & Karen Tan are truly iconic theatre makers in Singapore. S.I.T.F.E is truly pleased to have them come onboard our second instalment of *SOLO/ORAY AAL* along with the younger theatre makers and enthusiasts. We are also excited to welcome Esplanade on board as a co-producer. Being a young arts organisation, such support from a national institution such as Esplanade and other theatre practitioners are a testament to S.I.T.F.E's direction. Last year's theme was FIGHT. With positive changes globally, and to show appreciation for life, S.I.T.F.E has decided to set CELEBRATION as the theme for this year's *SOLO/ORAY AAL*.

In this production, with the intention to bring both theatre veterans and new theatre practitioners together, we have put together different writers, actors and directors. In 2021's SOLO/ORAY AAL, we featured four actors and two actresses. This year, we will be featuring two actors and four actresses. SYNOPSIS

Kannagi, a legendary Tamil woman, tells her story of how she lost her husband, whom a king alleged stole his queen's anklet. Without being tried, her husband was beheaded. Does she seek justice in the form of epic vengeance that kills the lives of innocent people? Exhausted by what to do, Kannagi falls asleep. In her dream, she time-travels. She meets two important personalities in the future – a rape victim and a mother whose son was murdered. Kannagi then returns to her time period and deeply contemplates her two encounters. Waking up, she is ready to make her decision. THROUGH THE FIRE, inspired by Virginia Woolf's Orlando, employs its time-travel device, enabling Kannagi to confront possibilities to re-imagine her fate.



ALVIN TAN WRITER - DIRECTOR



Alvin is the Founder and the Artistic Director of The Necessary Stage. He is also the current Artistic Director of the M1 Singapore Fringe Festival. Alvin has been awarded a Fulbright Scholarship, the Young Artist Award (1998) and the Cultural Medallion (2014). In 2010, he was conferred the Chevalier des Arts et des Lettres by the French Ministry of Culture.

INDUMATHI TAMILSELVAN CO-WRITER - ACTRESS



Armed with a BA in Acting from LASALLE, and a Diploma in Applied Drama and Psychology from Singapore Polytechnic, Indumathi Tamilselvan is an all-rounded Theatre Practitioner, Founder and Director of Tongue in Cheek Productions, and a fervent believer in the use of theatre to reach out and shape the world we live in. She is currently pursuing her MA in Arts Pedagogy and Practice at LASALLE College of the Arts. Indu has adopted a range of roles throughout her career, and is continuing to hone her skills: actor, director, drama educator, applied drama practitioner and entrepreneur. Her works on stage, as an actress, include Between 5 Cows and the Deep Blue Sea (Esplanade's Kalaa Utsavam 2022).





SYNOPSIS

Just like a river delta where sand deposits slow down the flow of the river, **MOUTH OF RIVER**, Ananya is not fully able to pee due to a condition called cystocele. This story shares the journey, ,trials and tribulations of Ananya, as she shares how this condition has affected her smooth life.

This monologue celebrates the willpower of women and how we appreciate the simplest things in life.

Syed is a writer, actor, voice artist and educator with 10 years of experience in the media and theatre industry. He has written stories, scripts, and screenplay for television programmes and drama series, mainly aired on Mediacorp Vasantham. Syed's theatre journey began in 2013 during his university days. He was part of the 2013 and 2015 scriptwriter team for NUS Tamil Language Society's Sangae Muzhangu. Syed has also acted in theatre plays, including NUS TLS's Sangae Muzhangu and SITFE's Thuyil (Sleep). In recognition of his contribution to the Tamil arts and media scene, Syed was awarded the 2021 Kaviyarasu Kannadasan Award by the Association of Singapore Tamil Writers.

PONKUMARAN SELVAM Director



Ponkumaran is a theatre enthusiast whose journey started during University days through NUSTLS's Sangae Muzhangu, where he acted in 2011 & 2013, was one of the producers in 2013 and directed the 2015 edition. Over the years, he has acted with different tamil theatre groups in a variety of plays. Some of his recent works as an actor includes SITFE's THUYIL and Agam Theatre Lab's *Animal Farm*.

INDU ELANGOVAN ACTRESS



All through her schooling days, Indu got a chance to immerse herself in theatre, dance and film. She enjoys being onstage where she can put her thoughts, ideas, emotions, actions, and imagination in the spotlight. She got a chance to explore the Tamil theatre scene in 2017 and she loved how the language and cultural elements were highlights in many of the Tamil plays. SYNOPSIS

Almost always, sexual victimisation is characterised as a "women's issue". As such, many men with traumatic experiences suffer in silence throughout their lives. Social attitudes and stereotypes about men and masculinity make it even harder. Where do men go for help when they need it? How do they overcome the stigma and shame? And most importantly, what do they do to keep going on with life?

In **TOUCH ME NOT**, Manvir, a 28-year-old Sikh, battles with a traumatic past. In his quest to overcome stigma and shame, Manvir learns to celebrate life's simplest joys and smallest wins in his journey of healing and living.

UMAYAL THIRUSELVAM WRITER





SYNOPSIS

Originally written as VEEDU, **HOME** is about old lady who was born in Malaysia, recollects her fond memories of her life as she had to travel from one space to another, taking on different roles at different phases of her lifetime.

Upon marriage, she comes to Singapore and moves into a HDB flat. Each corner and space within the house never fails to bring smiles to her wrinkled face as intimate memories engulf her in a way she can't understand. She embraces the sweet feeling. Just as she thought the house with fond memories of her children and deceased husband is going to be her final place of rest, something unexpected happens, making it very hard for the old lady to grapple with the painful truth about the space she had been regarding as her dear home.



KANAGALATHA WRITER



Kanagalatha (Latha) has published three collections of poetry in Tamil: Theeveli (Firespace) (2003), Paampuk Kaattil Oru Thaazhai (A Screwpine in Snakeforest) (2004) and Yaarukkum Illaatha Paalai (No man's desert) 2016. She has also published two short story collections Nan kolai Seyium penkkal (Women I Murder) in 2007, which won the biennial Singapore Literature Prize in 2008 and Chinalatchumi in 2022. Her works have been translated into English, French and German. Kanagalatha is one of the founding director for Poetry Festival Singapore. She is currently the Associate editor of Tamil Murasu, Singapore's Tamil daily newspaper.

YEO HON BENG DIRECTOR



Yeo Hon Beng has extensive experience in the arts and entertainment and has worked with various theatre/arts companies and production companies in diverse capacities such as director, lighting designer, set designer and technical/production/stage manager since 1997. SYNOPSIS

Not everyone is behind bars. This is a story about how people (especially depending on their gender) are sacrificed for the country, for other humans or for other genders. And the struggle between life and death during those sacrifices. WHO'S TO BE SACRIFICED? looks at three characters: a contemporary reimagining of the male character Aravan from the Indian epic tale the Mahabharata; a transperson whose job is to sing laments (oppari) during death ceremonies in the villages; a devadasi who was a female artist dedicated to the worship and service of a deity or a temple for the rest of her life.

Some contemporary questions and concepts are explored using these three characters. Who can plan or impose these to another human? And how aware of these characters about what they are going to involve? What is self-sacrifice?

Why aren't others resisting this discrimination?



ABINAYA JOTHI ACTRESS - WRITER





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
