



FESTIVAL DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE KUIK SWEE BOON

It has been fifteen years since our first edition of cont·act Contemporary Dance Festival. Two years ago, we reaffirmed our unwavering commitment to supporting the development of contemporary dance in Singapore with the refreshed Festival name of cont·act in English, and reverting to the original name in Chinese. This year's edition in June, "On the cusp", signifies a year of transition for the Festival ahead of the celebration of our 15th edition next year with an announcement of our upcoming plans for the Festival ahead. (Due to the pandemic, the 12th edition of the Festival spanned 2 years.)

This year's programme highlights are a dual world premiere in the double bill, Elusive, with works by the talented German and Italian duo Panzetti/Ticconi, and South Korean Kim Jae Duk who has not been in Singapore for four years already, along with a series of works-in-progress by artists from home and abroad. This includes Taiwanese artist Chang Chien-Hao with a familiar German artist Jan Möllmer, Hong Kong's Ong Yong Lock, Israel's Ravid Abarbanel, and T.H.E's senior dance artist Klievert Jon Mendoza creating on T.H.E Second Company.

From our audience's enthusiastic responses to last year's Open Stage, I have reason to believe that many may feel disappointed by the absence of this platform this year. However, please be assured that cont-act's current transformation is to ensure that it can run more healthily and sustainably. While we take some time to reimagine the meaning and position of the Festival, one thing is certain: our efforts and determination to promote and explore how contemporary dance can foster mutual understanding remain unchanged. We have big dreams of continually bettering our community, society, and world, and we want to continue preserving space for artistic freedom and imagination. Enjoy this year's edition, and stay tuned for the exciting updates to come!

CHOREOGRAPHERS

Klievert Jon Mendoza graduated from the Philippines High School for the Arts where he received the Outstanding Student Artist Award in 2015. He went on to study at Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts (NAFA) in 2018 where he graduated with a Diploma in Dance (Distinction), was named Best Graduate, and received the NAFA President Award. Klievert was the first Filipino to compete in the Youth America Grand Prix 2018, and was awarded the Gold Medal in the pre-professional category of the 2014 Concours International De Danse Classique De Grasse in Paris, France.

Following his graduation from NAFA, Klievert joined T.H.E Dance Company in 2018. Since then, he has graced stages both local and international, captivating audiences with performances at renowned festivals such as Inteatro Festival, Cross Festival, Florence Dance Festival, and OzAsia, among many others.

Beyond being a performer, Klievert has also ventured into choreography, showcasing his creativity and artistic vision. He took the helm in choreographing the 2020–2021 editions of liTHE, demonstrating his versatility and depth as an artist. Currently, Klievert is poised to embark on a new creative endeavour, given the opportunity to create an incubation work with T.H.E Second Company for the 14th edition of cont-act Contemporary Dance Festival.

CHOREOGRAPHERS

Founder and Artistic Director of T.H.E Dance Company (est. 2008) and its annual cont-act Contemporary Dance Festival (est. 2010), Swee Boon rose from performing in Singapore People's Association Dance Company and Singapore Dance Theatre to becoming the principal dancer of Spain's Compañia Nacional de Danza (CND) from 2002—2007, performing in works by then Artistic Director Nacho Duato, as well as renowned guest choreographers such as Jiri Kylian, Mats Ek, Ohad Naharin and Wim Vandekeybus.

Under Swee Boon's direction, T.H.E has become a seminal dance company with a signature voice derived from training in his HollowBody™ methodology, developed from 2016. This methodology informs Swee Boon's repertoire of works for T.H.E that has toured many international festivals, including a 360° virtual reality (VR) adaptation of *PheNoumenon* (2019) created during the pandemic. His numerous commissions include *Infinitely Closer* (2022) for Esplanade's da:ns festival, which also marked the opening of the Singtel Waterfront Theatre.

Swee Boon is a 2007 Young Artist Award recipient, a 2003 Benois De La Danse Award nominee, and a 2021—2023 fellow with the International Society for the Performing Arts.

COLLABORATORS

Kent Lee is a sound artist and musician living and working in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. A self-taught artist who also delves into different disciplines and artistic practices, he is gravitating towards the experimental side of music — blending acoustics sounds with electronic gadgetry, favouring improvisations over rigid compositions.

Kent has composed, recorded, and performed for dance and musical theatre productions, including the award-winning Seni Tiga's multidisciplinary performance *Impermanence* (Malaysia), which won him the Best Music & Sound Design at the 16th BOH Cameronian Arts Awards 2019.

Having been collaborating with Singaporean contemporary dance company The Human Expression (T.H.E) since 2018, Kent was the music composer and sound designer for *Infinitely Closer* by Kuik Swee Boon and T.H.E Dance Company. Commissioned by Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay for 2022's da:ns festival, the work also marked the opening of the new Singtel Waterfront Theatre. In 2023, Kent was invited to be a part of Islands Time-Based Art Festival (ITBA) to present a new solo piece during Singapore Art Week.

Kent is also one part of Shaman Tearoom, a multi-disciplinary art collective exploring the subject matter of stillness and fluxes in life by integrating tea ceremonies, sound and music, and contemporary art.





Pei Yao joined T.H.E Second Company in 2024.



Unique to the company is its stringent technique training programme — one that is rarely available to individuals outside of a professional dance company. Members are taught by T.H.E's core artistic team and guest instructors, grounding them with a sound level of physical aptitude to tackle the demands of contemporary dance. Members also receive critical professional feedback on their performances and choreographic creations.

The rigorous yet open nature of T.H.E Second Company's training empowers individuals to develop their artistic practice alongside their educational, work and personal commitments. Equally significant are the myriad opportunities for exposure and performance, encouraging members to make the most of their training and to aim for higher artistic excellence.

Members of T.H.E Second Company have performed at cont-act Contemporary Dance Festival, high profile commissions such as Singapore:Inside Out and Singapore Chinese Cultural Centre's inaugural Cultural Extravaganza 2017, local and international festivals including NUS Arts Festival, Singapore Writers Festival and Seoul International Dance Festival, as well as overseas tours with T.H.E Dance Company.

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












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
