FESTIVAL DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

KUIK SWEE BOON

It has been fifteen years since our first edition of cont·act Contemporary Dance Festival. Two years ago, we reaffirmed our unwavering commitment to supporting the development of contemporary dance in Singapore with the refreshed Festival name of cont·act in English, and reverting to the original name in Chinese. This year's edition in June, "On the cusp", signifies a year of transition for the Festival ahead of the celebration of our 15th edition next year with an announcement of our upcoming plans for the Festival ahead. (Due to the pandemic, the 12th edition of the Festival spanned 2 years.)

This year's programme highlights are a dual world premiere in the double bill, *Elusive*, with works by the talented German and Italian duo Panzetti/Ticconi, and South Korean Kim Jae Duk who has not been in Singapore for four years already, along with a series of works-in-progress by artists from home and abroad. This includes Taiwanese artist Chang Chien-Hao with a familiar German artist Jan Möllmer, Hong Kong's Ong Yong Lock, Israel's Ravid Abarbanel, and T.H.E's senior dance artist Klievert Jon Mendoza creating on T.H.E Second Company.

From our audience's enthusiastic responses to last year's Open Stage, I have reason to believe that many may feel disappointed by the absence of this platform this year. However, please be assured that cont·act's current transformation is to ensure that it can run more healthily and sustainably. While we take some time to reimagine the meaning and position of the Festival, one thing is certain: our efforts and determination to promote and explore how contemporary dance can foster mutual understanding remain unchanged. We have big dreams of continually bettering our community, society, and world, and we want to continue preserving space for artistic freedom and imagination. Enjoy this year's edition, and stay tuned for the exciting updates to come!

CHORALES

CHOREOGRAPHER'S NOTE —

The soft movement in the deep sea.

Chorales is rather different from the works I have done thus far with T.H.E — it focuses on my perspective of the body and its beauty, and especially on temporality. With the transient nature of performance, the sense of time in the work is ever changing. Ultimately, the performers' instincts and sensibilities will shape every moment.

The body is valued, and important. To showcase the body, I never ascribe any societal texts or issues to it. Instead, to help the audience ground their experience of the work, I turned to nature in search of elements that I could incorporate. The image of the deep sea and what lies beneath seems to be the best metaphor.

Some considerations:

1. What is the audience's perception of beauty? Will they see the beauty in what I perceive as so?
2. How do I let the audience find beauty in what may seem unsightly?
3. In this work, music is just a space that the dance occupies. The movements and the rhythm of the music are out of sync. Would audiences still be able to see this work as a dance, or would it be just a series of actions...?
4. The intended concept of this work is the swaying, fluttering pressure of the deep sea.
5. What is the artist's and the audience's perception of "contemporary"?
6. In this work, the movement never stops — I use the word "sustain". Even in moments that seemed still, the movement never truly stopped.

MALEBRANCHE — HARLEKING MULTITUDE

MALEBRANCHE — Harleking multitude is a choreography for 5 performers born from materials developed in *Harleking*, originally created by and for the duo Panzetti/Ticconi.

The character of Harleking, multiplied and transformed by the interpreters of T.H.E, draws its roots from the Arlecchino (Harlequin) of the *Commedia dell'arte* (comedy of the profession)¹. A devious, witty servant, he is moved by primal instincts, a desire to attain the power that he simultaneously mocks, and an insatiable hunger. The Arlecchino evoked here shares ancient demonic roots with his distant predecessor Alichino, a devil from the demon group Malebranche in Dante Alighieri's *Inferno*².

Characteristics in the choreography reminiscent of ancient grotesques on buildings — extravagant, interlaced volutes of human and animal figures amidst curving foliage elements — support the construction of an ambiguous and mutable character. The language of the work possesses a hypnotic quality in which extreme and opposing contents merge into a system that confuses and surprises. In these persuasive transformations, the unsettling reveals itself unexpectedly, only to be veiled once more. This fluidity mirrors the slick force of communication, alongside which repetition and mutation are close companions. The figures, which although can evoke amusement, do not elicit any joy.

¹Commedia dell'arte (comedy of the profession) was an early form of professional theatre. It was an exclusively Italian phenomenon until it was popularised and spread throughout Europe between the 16th and 18th centuries.

²Dante Alighieri (c. 1265—14 September 1321), often referred to as Dante, was an Italian poet, writer and philosopher. *Inferno* is the first part of his 14th century epic poem *Divine Comedy*; the subsequent parts are *Purgatorio* and *Paradiso*.

Jae Duk has been T.H.E Dance Company's Resident Choreographer since 2010.

As Founder, Artistic Director and Principal Choreographer of Modern Table Dance Company (est. 2013), his works are known for their unique dynamic curves, rapid movements, and modern reinterpretation of traditional Korean forms, making him a highly sought-after choreographer beyond Korea. *Lub Dub*, choreographed for Bale Teatro Castro Alves, was selected by the Brazilian magazine BRAVO as one of the 10 best shows of 2017. Another notable work, *Darkness Poomba*, has been invited to The Place in London in 2016, Chekhov International Theatre Festival in 2017, Yokohama Dance Collection 2021 as a masterpiece selection, and to LG Arts Center in Seoul. Jae Duk's talents also extend to music; he composes the original music for almost all of his choreographies.

CHOREOGRAPHERS

Ginevra Panzetti and Enrico Ticconi, based in Berlin and Torino, have been working as a duo since 2008. Their artistic research interlaces dance, performance, and visual art, with deepening themes relating to the historical union between communication, violence and power. They draw on ancient imaginaries, creating hybrid figures or images between history and contemporaneity. Both graduated from the Academy of Fine Arts in Rome and attended Stoà, School for rhythmic movement and philosophy in Cesena, led by Claudia Castellucci.

In 2010, the duo moved to Germany and delved into mutually complementary paths: Ginevra studied Media Art at the Hochschule für Grafik und Buchkunst (HGB); Enrico Dance, Context, Choreography at the Inter-University Centre for Dance (HZT). They gained international recognition with their choreographic work *Harleking* (2018), presented at the European platform Aerowaves Twenty 19, New Italian Dance (NID) Platform and Tanzplattform Deutschland 2020. In 2019 they won the 13th Arte Laguna Prize for the site-specific performance *Jardin/ Arsenale*, received the Danza&Danza Prize as emerging choreographers and were nominees for the Promising Talent of the Year accolade by the Jahrbuch Tanz.

Their latest artistic research investigates the symbolic power of the flag and took shape through the realisation of a dyptic composed by the choreographic works *AeReA* (2019) and *Ara! Ara!* (2021), concluded by a filmic work *Silver Veiled* (2021).

INSEL, their most recent choreographic work for 4 performers, premiered in 2023 at Tanz Im August Festival in Berlin.

T.H.E DANCE COMPANY

The Human Expression (T.H.E) Dance Company was founded in 2008 by Artistic Director Kuik Swee Boon. Rooted firmly in Singapore yet universal in its perspective, T.H.E's contemporary dance works reveal the body as a medium for exploring and celebrating the human condition.

Dance artists at T.H.E are immersed in the Company's signature methodology, HollowBody™, which guides them to access their deeper instincts and impulses through movement. The Company's movement vocabulary is distinct in its intensely personal aesthetics, yet thrilling in its diversity. Driven by a sincere desire to uncover the intricate, complex and oft-times overlooked dimensions of human existence, the Company's incisive observations on the human condition and its original creations are an essential mirror to the issues and rhythms of contemporary life.

As one of Singapore's seminal contemporary dance companies, T.H.E has performed and toured at many major and prestigious festivals in Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand, Laos, South Korea, Japan, Taiwan, China, India, France, Italy, Poland, Denmark, Latvia, United Arab Emirates, Australia, and New Zealand.

Based on its vision of contemporary dance as a medium for nurturing human potential, T.H.E has also actively initiated numerous platforms to engage young artists and the wider public. Since it was founded, the Company also started its semi-professional wing, T.H.E Second Company, which identifies and mentors dance artists who aspire to reach a professional standard of contemporary dance. In 2010, T.H.E also founded the cont·act Contemporary Dance Festival (previously known as the M1 Contact Contemporary Dance Festival) – the country's first annual contemporary dance festival to showcase local and international artists. The Company also regularly runs public classes, workshops, and customised programmes for schools and the community.

T.H.E DANCE COMPANY

Fiona has been a full-time Dance Artist with T.H.E Dance Company since 2019, and was recently appointed as the Assistant to Artistic Director. Over the years with the company, she has been in numerous works by Kuik Swee Boon, resident choreographer Kim Jae Duk, and guest choreographers Dimo Kirilov Milev, Jos Baker, Albert Tiong and Anthea Seah. Fiona also had the honour to tour internationally with the company to various festivals such as Tanzmesse, OzAsia, Oriente Occidente and other independent venues such as Scenario Pubblico (Italy) and The Coronet Theatre (United Kingdom). In addition to performing, Presently, Fiona teaches, choreographs and facilitates HollowBody™ workshops with and for the main company, T.H.E Second Company, and T.H.E Training Initiative.

Prior to joining the company, Fiona had the pleasure of working with local choreographers such as Jeffrey Tan, Ryan Tan, Zaki Ahmad and Wee Ee-Ching. She was trained in various dance genres such as hip hop, jazz and street jazz before discovering her interest in contemporary dance. Her diverse exposure has given rise to a love for exploring and formulating unique movement phrases, and infusing different quirks into her movement. She has a deep interest in helping movers and non-movers alike to unlock the physical potential of their bodies, and connecting the community through the power of the arts.

Billy Keohavong is a first-generation Laotian-Australian artist based in Eora (Sydney). He is a scholarship recipient of both New Zealand School of Dance and Ev & Bow Full-Time Training Centre. Billy is a movement coach and improvisational specialist focusing on character work and sensorial work.

His experiences extend to international borders where he has returned to Singapore as the current Rehearsal Master and Dance Artist with T.H.E Dance Company. He has performed extensively within festivals like Florence Dance Festival (Italy), Fukuoka Fringe Dance Festival (Japan), Daegu Dance Festival (South Korea) and Sydney Festival (Sydney). Billy has also worked with highly acclaimed choreographers such as Kuik Swee Boon, Kim Jae Duk, Ross McCormack, Sue Healy, Martin Del Amo, Meryl Tankard and Dimo Kirilov Milev.



Klievert Jon Mendoza graduated from the Philippines High School for the Arts where he received the Outstanding Student Artist Award in 2015. He went on to study at Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts (NAFA) in 2018 where he graduated with a Diploma in Dance (Distinction), was named Best Graduate, and received the NAFA President Award. Klievert was the first Filipino to compete in the Youth America Grand Prix 2018, and was awarded the Gold Medal in the pre-professional category of the 2014 Concours International De Danse Classique De Grasse in Paris, France.

Following his graduation from NAFA, Klievert joined T.H.E Dance Company in 2018. Since then, he has graced stages both local and international, captivating audiences with performances at renowned festivals such as Inteatro Festival, Cross Festival, Florence Dance Festival, and OzAsia, among many others.

Beyond being a performer, Klievert has also ventured into choreography, showcasing his creativity and artistic vision. He took the helm in choreographing the 2020–2021 editions of liTHE, demonstrating his versatility and depth as an artist. Currently, Klievert is poised to embark on a new creative endeavour, given the opportunity to create an incubation work with T.H.E Second Company for the 14th edition of cont·act Contemporary Dance Festival.

Trained in ballet and Chinese dance from a young age, Haruka's formal introduction to contemporary dance began at School of the Arts Singapore. In 2017, she was accepted into the New Zealand School of Dance majoring in Contemporary Dance where she got to train with a prestigious faculty that included Victoria Colombus, Paula Steeds Huston, James O'Hara, Balázs Busa, Daniel Jaber and other guest teachers. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, she was unable to complete her final year at NZSD and returned to Singapore, where she joined T.H.E Dance Company in January 2021.

Han-Wei joined T.H.E Dance Company in 2024, marking his first significant milestone in his dance career.

Carmelita was born in Singapore, grew up in Sydney, Australia and trained in classical and contemporary dance from a young age. Carmelita has performed in Stephanie Lake Company's internationally toured work *Colossus* as part of Newcastle's New Annual Festival.

She worked with the Australian Ballet Company as a junior artist in the professional productions of *The Nutcracker* and *The Story of Clara*, working alongside former Artistic Director, David McAllister. Carmelita also spent four years teaching and choreographing at North Shore Dance Academy Sydney, coaching contemporary, classical and commercial styles to younger dancers.
