WHAT IS SOCIALLY ENGAGED ART?

Drama Box calls itself a socially engaged theatre company. What does that mean?

Socially engaged practice, also referred to as social practice or socially engaged art, can include any art form which **involves people** and **communities** in **debate**, **collaboration** or **social interaction**. This can often be organised as the result of an outreach or education programme, but many independent artists also use it within their work.

The participatory element of socially engaged practice, is key, with the artworks created often holding equal or less importance to the collaborative act of creating them. As Tom Finkelpearl outlines in his book *What We Made: Conversations on Art and Social Cooperation*, social practice is 'art that's socially engaged, where the social interaction is at some level the art'.

Socially engaged practice can be associated with activism because it often deals with political issues. Artists who work within this field will often spend much time integrating into the specific community which they wish to help, educate or simply share with.

- What would you do when someone has a different view from you?
- If an eviction happened, what were your thoughts having seen the last eviction process happen?

WHAT IS THE LESSON?

Created by Drama Box and Li Xie, *The Lesson* was first presented as part of *It Won't Be Too Long* at the Singapore International Festival of Arts in 2015 to critical acclaim. Lauded by local media as one of the best productions of 2015, it was praised for effectively engaging the public in the discussion on land use issues in Singapore.

Drama Box has since brought the piece overseas to audiences in Taiwan (December 2016), the International Community Arts Festival in Rotterdam (March 2017) and Macau (March 2019). *The Lesson* also travelled with Drama Box's very own *GoLi – the Moving Theatre* to three local public spaces (Bugis, Toa Payoh and Hougang) in 2017.



Since 2016, the piece has also been adapted for schools and piloted as a theatre programme for youths at more than 20 local secondary and tertiary institutions. In 2019, we partnered with Esplanade to bring students into the theatre space to experience *The Lesson*, as part of their *Feed Your Imagination (F.Y.I)* series. The version you participated in has been adapted specially to connect with the youths of today.
