





#### Performance Guide

#### Optional Esplanade Tour or Trail

Schools have the option to choose to go on an Esplanade Tour (guided) or an Esplanade Trail (self-guided).

Tours are limited, on a first-come, first-served basis. Access to venues depends on availability.





Based on the learning objectives, *F.Y.I* productions can be classified under these categories.



Productions under this category address ethical and social-emotional issues that are fundamental to the growth of a person of good character.

Key objectives include equipping students with tools to cultivate strong values through self-reflection, engender students with a sense of self-worth, and encourage them to understand, evaluate and appreciate multiple perspectives.

Examples of topics include those related to selfesteem, identity, prejudice, family and social relationships.



Productions under this category are representative of art forms from various cultures and traditions, ranging from music, dance, and drama.

Key objectives include heightening students' cultural awareness and engaging with the world they live in. Through exposure to these art forms, students will begin to understand and appreciate their own and/or others' histories, traditions and cultures.



Productions under this category address community, national and/or global issues, in line with emerging 21st century competencies.

Key objectives include equipping students with the tools to cultivate concerned, informed and responsible citizens through the subject matter discussed within the production.

Examples of topics include those related to the preservation of culture and heritage, exploring ideas related to national identity and learning more about important historical events and their impact.



Productions under this category expose students to genre-specific art forms in a supported environment, and are scaffolded for novices.

Key objectives include heightening students' awareness and enhancing their knowledge of a genre-specific art form, while cultivating an appreciation for the aesthetics, practice and expressions of the form.

Some examples of genre-specific art forms include jazz, contemporary dance and traditional forms of puppetry.





In this audiovisual-illustration book, readers follow the journey of Pei as she interacts with different buildings in the heart of Singapore. 



The first episode of *The Thursday Afternoon Club*, an original series where characters experience various adventures and struggles together, this performance was born from a desire to create a safe space where students can process their anxieties and struggles in dealing with studies and friendship while finding their place in life. 





# Samsui Women: One Brick at a Time

A destructive fire razes through the squatter settlement of Bukit Ho Swee, leaving thousands of families homeless. To help the victims of the fire, Swee Leng, a Samsui woman, rises to the occasion and volunteers her time in the rebuilding efforts. Through sheer hard work and perseverance, she earns the respect of her peers and becomes a foreman at a construction site.

Set in 1960s Singapore, *Samsui Women: One Brick at a Time* is a life-sized puppetry performance based on the lives of the Samsui women of Singapore. Part fact and part fiction, it is a moving story about dedication, duty, and honour—reflecting the values and sacrifices that the dedicated Samsui women of yesteryears live by.



A live film set; musicians on standby; instruments, props and costume in position; stories waiting to unfold.

To celebrate 15 years together as a band, OrkeStar Trio decides to hire a director to help them make music videos for some of their greatest hits. The director pairs their music with regional folklore and legends that feature stars, choosing many different styles, mediums, and genres in the storytelling. This director also invites busloads of students to be featured extras, with the intentions of creating epic visuals and sonic textures in a process they dub as 'communal TikTok'.

A journey is set, as they explore the bands extensive discography—from the traditional to the contemporary—navigating their way through stories across time and space, finding new narratives in everyone present in that hour.

Legend of the Three Stars is a story within a story, which illustrates the wonders of storytelling, and the different variations of how a story can be told. Part concert, part immersive performance, participants will be treated to an interactive experience at the intersection of music, film, and theatre.

Featuring local ensemble OrkeStar Trio, director Irfan Kasban, and a talented team of multidisciplinary artists, this work promises to be a riveting experience.



# Yusof: Portrait of a President

In 1961, Singapore's first president, Yusof Ishak delivered a watershed speech at the National Day Mass Rally. A man of ideals who dared to dream of a peaceful and successful nation despite 200 years of colonial rule, he spoke of how democracy could transform Singapore into a country of great national unity and solidarity.

Yusof traces his journey from humble beginnings as a journalist to becoming Singapore's first head of state, and offers a rare glimpse into the life and times of this extraordinary leader who dedicated his life in service to Singapore.

First commissioned for *Pesta Raya – Malay Festival of Arts 2015*, Yusof is written by playwright and director Zizi Azah binte Abdul Majid and is based on her research and interviews.

Pada tahun 1961, Yusof Ishak, ketua negara pertama Singapura, menyampaikan ucapan bersejarah semasa Perhimpunan Hari Kebangsaan. Seorang pemimpin berprinsip yang berani mengimpikan sebuah negara yang aman dan makmur selepas 200 tahun penjajahan, beliau menyeru rakyat untuk memahami bagaimana demokrasi mampu membentuk Singapura menjadi sebuah negara yang bersatu padu dan harmoni.

Yusof menelusuri perjalanan hidup Yusof Ishak—daripada permulaannya yang sederhana sebagai seorang wartawan, sehinggalah menjadi ketua negara pertama Singapura. Kisah ini memberikan pandangan mendalam dan jarang ditemui tentang kehidupan seorang pemimpin luar biasa yang mendedikasikan hidupnya demi berkhidmat kepada tanah airnya.

Karya Yusof pertama kali diterbitkan untuk *Pesta Raya – Malay Festival of Arts 2015*. Ia ditulis oleh penulis dan pengarah Zizi Azah binti Abdul Majid, berdasarkan kajian mendalam dan temu bual yang dijalankannya.





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
