



About Esplanade - Theatres on the Bay

Esplanade is Singapore's national performing arts centre. It hosts a year-round line-up of about 4,000 live performances and activities presented by Esplanade, its partners and hirers. As an arts centre for everyone, Esplanade also creates opportunities for seniors, youth, children and underserved communities to experience the arts. More than 70% of the shows that take place each year at the centre are free for all to enjoy.

Esplanade also brings the arts virtually to audiences in Singapore and beyond, through its diverse range of digital programmes on *Esplanade Offstage*, an all-access backstage pass to the performing arts and guide to Singapore and Asian arts and culture, with videos, podcasts, articles, quizzes and resources.

The centre works in close partnership with local, regional and international artists to develop artistic capabilities and content, push artistic boundaries and engage audiences. Esplanade supports the creation of artistic content by commissioning and producing new Singapore and Asian work for the international stage. It also develops technical capabilities for the industry nationally.

Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay is operated by The Esplanade Co Ltd (TECL), which is a not-for-profit organisation, a registered Charity and an Institution of a Public Character. TECL received the Charity Governance Award – Special Commendation for Clarity of Strategy in 2016 and 2022, the Charity Transparency Award from 2016 – 2023, and the Charity Transparency Dedication Award in 2024. Esplanade is Singapore's first Dementia-Friendly Arts Venue and a certified Dementia Go-To Point, as well as a guide/assistance dog friendly centre.

TECL receives funding support from Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth and its Community Programmes are supported by Tote Board Family, comprising Tote Board, Singapore Pools and Singapore Turf Club.

The festival continues to champion new creations by Singapore artists, with six new works in the line-up this year, including four Esplanade co-productions and one Esplanade commission. *Mission Malligapoo* by inventive theatre-makers **AGAM Theatre Lab** is a playful and heartwarming production, while dynamic music group **SwaRhythm** brings *Samudra*, a captivating new production inspired by the ebb and flow of the ocean. In a bold meeting of genres, trailblazing metal band **RUDRA** joins forces with the refined musicianship of **Resound Collective** for an unforgettable orchestral experience. Acclaimed Singapore poet **Pooja Nansi** explores love and belonging in the lyrical

We Make Spaces Divine ft. Dey, and the powerful Shikhandi by SIFAS Productions Ltd blends the grace of kathak with the dynamism of bharatanatyam. The genre-bending local Latin jazz fusion band Project RA teams up with virtuoso vocalist Varijashree Venugopal to weave intricate Carnatic melodies with vibrant jazz improvisation in a performance bursting with rhythmic vitality and soulful depth.

From further afield, legendary poet and lyricist **Javed Akhtar** is set to enchant with *Main Koi Aisa Geet Gaoon*, an intimate evening of words and melodies, while beloved stand-up star **Zakir Khan** returns to Singapore with his trademark warmth, wit, and relatable humour.

Also not to be missed are the visually arresting *Kintsugi* by Canada's renowned **Sampradaya Dance Creations**, multi-instrumentalist **Soumik Datta's** poignant, music-driven reflection on memory and Alzheimer's disease, *Mone Rekho*, and Malaysian hip-hop powerhouse **Rabbit Mac's** high-energy showcase with his friends. Families can delight in the charming *Circle of Life* by **Ranga Shankara's AHA! Theatre for Children**, specially created for children as young as five.

Throughout the festival, we are also delighted to offer many free programmes at Esplanade's public spaces, where audiences can enjoy live music, dance and storytelling. These free programmes not only make the arts more accessible but also allow families, friends, and curious passersby to come together and experience the joy of *Kalaa Utsavam* together.

DIRECTORS' MESSAGES

In the golden seams of kintsugi, beauty finds its purest form—Victor Ruiz

From the time I attended a kintsugi exhibit at Toronto's Japanese Cultural Centre in 2022, I was immediately drawn to this profound Japanese art form, deeply rooted in its philosophy of wabi-sabi—a celebration of beauty in imperfection. Kintsugi, the Japanese craft of mending broken pottery with gold, transforms damage into art, honouring and elevating brokenness itself.

We live in fragile times; the fractures in the relationships we hold sacred threaten our capacity for empathy and healing. Are we not all kintsugi—constantly breaking and mending over time, with each repair restoring new meaning to our lives.

Our new production, *Kintsugi*, gathers the fragmented pieces of self, story, and identity and reimagines them into a new wholeness. The stories at the heart of this work come from the *Mahabharata*, but their resonance lies in the universal fractures of our contemporary world. By reframing these epics through the philosophy of kintsugi, we place the past alongside the present, enriching both.

Concept & Choreography – KINTSUGI Artist Director Emerita, Sampradaya Dance Creations In the Japanese art of mending with gold, Lata *akka* and I discovered a profound metaphor for the human spirit: that the marks of breakage are not flaws to be hidden, but stories to be honoured. This philosophy has shaped not just the choreography, but also the music, visuals, and emotional backbone of the work.

Within Sampradaya's repertoire, *Kintsugi* occupies the unique space of bridging *bharatanatyam*'s classical rigour with contemporary dance's fluidity and urgency while venturing into uncharted terrain. In pushing into this new territory, we invited Al as our creative partner, which has challenged, provoked and deepened our creative process. Drawing from Indian epics while reflecting our present-day moments of heartbreak and hope, Kintsugi, for me, becomes a meditation on what we lose, mend, and endure.

It reflects the company's evolution: rooted in tradition, fearless in experiment, and devoted to telling stories that connect the personal with the universal.

SYNOPSIS

Kintsugi is a striking new production from Sampradaya Dance Creations, inspired by the Japanese art of mending broken pottery with gold. Conceived by Founder Lata Pada and co-choreographed with Artistic Director Suma Suresh, this Indian classical-contemporary work transforms themes of fracture and repair into a moving expression of strength, beauty, and identity.

Kintsugi revisits poignant episodes from the Mahabharata that are both timely and timeless, speaking to collective perseverance and the enduring power of transformation.

Performed to live music, with a cast of six dancers trained in bharatanatyam, kathak, and contemporary vocabularies, Kintsugi features an original score that blends classical Indian music with electronic textures, evoking a layered emotional landscape of rupture and repair.

Kintsugi's performance in Singapore is an Asian premiere, after which the work will tour to India and Indonesia.

TALES FROM THE MAHABHARATA*

Son Of The Forest

In a forest clearing, Ekalavya, a skilled archer and *guru-dakshina* from the Nishada tribe, makes an unthinkable offer to Dronacharya: his thumb. A disciple denied yet unbowed, Ekalavya's spirit endures, remembered by the forest though erased from the royal courts. This retelling from the *Mahabharata* reveals the tension between devotion and hierarchy, privilege and sacrifice.

The Gamble

In the aftermath of a fateful dice game, Draupadi and Yudhishthira face each other in the silence of betrayal. She questions *dharma* itself as he wrestles with guilt and shame. This evocative dialogue reveals the reckoning between queen and king, wife and husband, dignity and humiliation.

A Mother's Dream

On the eve of war, Kunti reveals the secret that binds her sons. She dreams of them not as warriors, but as brothers. In her vision, she pleads for the battle to end, for love to prevail over vengeance. Torn between love and duty, Kunti awakens to the unbearable truth: her sons will face one another, and war is inevitable.

Through The Daughter's Eyes

After the war, Dushala compels her mother, Gandhari, to confront the cost of a love that blinded her to her sons' evil. Through haunting movement and vivid imagery, the scene traces the devastation of Kurukshetra—yet within the ruin, reveals a glimmer of truth and resilience.

Through tours and festival performances in Canada and abroad, SDC shares bharatanatyam with their diverse audiences while uniting cultures through this classical dance form.

ABOUT THE DIRECTORS



Lata Pada

Lata Pada C.M., Founder and Artistic Director Emerita of Sampradaya Dance Creations, is an acclaimed dancer, choreographer, teacher, cultural consultant, and one of Canada's leading artists and arts advocates. The first South Asian artist to receive the Order

of Canada (2009), she has also been honoured with India's Pravasi Bharatiya Samman (2011) and the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal (2012) for her contributions to the arts and community. A visionary in promoting South Asian dance in Canada, she has mentored generations of artists.

Suma Suresh



Suma Suresh, Artistic Director of Sampradaya Dance Creations, stepped into the role after six years of mentorship under Lata Pada. She holds an MFA in Dance Choreography from York University, where she earned the Susan Crocker and John Hunkin Scholarship in Fine Arts (2014–2015), She also received the 2019

MARTY Award for Dance. Her works include *Kindred* (2016), *Transcendence* (2016), *Sankhya* (2022), *Mandala* (2019), and the company's 35th Anniversary production, *Salaam Rahman* (2024).

MEET THE ARTISTS



Tanveer Alam - Dancer

Tanveer Alam is a Toronto-based *kathak* exponent and Western contemporary dance graduate from Dance Arts Institute of Canada (2019). Trained initially by Sudeshna Maulik and later by Sandhya Desai, he has performed with artists including Rina Singha,

Lata Pada, Padmini Chettur, and Peter Chin. His works have been presented at SummerWorks, Battery Dance Festival, Tangente, CanAsian Dance Festival, and MAI. Tanveer has also contributed to curatorial initiatives with Dancemakers, TOES FOR DANCE, and Toronto Public Library.



Rachana Joshi - Dancer

Rachana Joshi is a *bharatanatyam* dancer, choreographer, and teacher based in Toronto. A graduate of York University's BFA Dance program, she trained under Lata Pada at Sampradaya Dance Academy, where she now teaches and performs as a

company dancer. She is also a performer with Nova Dance, appearing in works like *Svaha!* (2022) and *Decoded Dances* (2024). As Artistic Director of Kala Dance Collective, she curates performances and community training initiatives that support diasporic South Asian dance artists.



B.C. Manjunath - Musician

B.C. Manjunath is a dynamic and acclaimed musician recognised nationally and internationally. He has performed on major stages worldwide, collaborating with leading artists across genres spanning Indian classical, world music, jazz, contemporary

dance, and contemporary classical. Known for his mastery of *konnakol*, he is also proficient in Western notation and works closely with composers across traditions. A sought-after educator, he conducts workshops globally and has numerous recordings to his credit. In January 2025, he performed at Rashtrapati Bhavan for India's 76th Republic Day.



Harikishan S. Nair - Dancer

Harikishan S. Nair is a multifaceted dance artist, teacher, choreographer, actor, mentor, dramaturge, and rehearsal director. Trained in *bharatanatyam*, *mohiniyattam*, and *kuchipudi*, he advocates for equity in South Asian dance within Canada's arts

landscape. His choreographic works have toured widely, and he leads workshops across North America, with presentations in India, the UK, Canada, and the USA. He is Co-Founder of Atam Arts Collective, Co-Director of the South Asian Dance Alliance of Canada, and Associate Artistic Director at NANDA Dancetheatre.



Atri Nundy - Dancer

Atri Nundy is a mid-career bharatanatyam artist, educator, and choreographer who trained under Lata Pada at Sampradaya Dance Academy, where she continues to teach. She refines her practice through mentorship with artists such as Leela

Samson, Mavin Khoo, Priyadarshini Govind, and Seeta Patel. Atri's choreographic work spans classical and contemporary forms, with commissions from Anandam Dancetheatre (*Mindful Chatter*, 2022) and Toronto Dance Theatre (*Helix*, 2023). She has performed with KasheDance, Ronald Taylor Dance, and other Toronto-based companies.



Praveen D. Rao - Musician

Praveen D. Rao is an accomplished Indian musician, music director, and lyricist specialising in Kannada songs. A student of Pt. R. V. Sheshadri Gawai of Aravinda Sangeetha Vidyalaya and tabla maestro Pandit Ravindra Yavagal, Praveen has

composed for theatre, ballets, films, television, and commercials. Proficient on the keyboard, tabla, and other instruments, Praveen has performed at major festivals including Pattadakal, Soorya, and Nishagandhi, with appearances across India, Great Britain, South Korea, Australia, Indonesia, the Middle East, Canada, and the USA.



Arun Sreekumar - Dancer

Arun Sreekumar is a South Asian emerging dance artist from Kerala, India, currently based in Toronto. He began his bharatanatyam training in 2018 under Guru Shyamala Surendran and continues under the mentorship of Harikishan S. Nair,

Artistic Director of Regatta Kala Kendra. Actively engaged in Toronto's dance scene, Arun has attended professional training workshops by Padmini Chettur and Padmashri Leela Samson through Anandam Dancetheatre. He has performed in works by Lata Pada, Suma Suresh and Harikishan Nair, and made his theatre debut with ATAM Arts Collective. A founding member of D-Squad Ontario, Arun specialises in *bharatanatyam* and semiclassical forms while exploring hip-hop. Currently balancing his career in IT with his artistic practice, he remains committed to deepening his training and artistic expression within Canada's South Asian dance community.



Varijashree Venugopal - Musician

Bangalore-based, Grammy®-nominated singer-songwriter Varijashree Venugopal was recognised early as a child prodigy, able to identify 100 carnatic ragas at just 18 months and performing publicly by age four. A singer, flautist, composer, and educator,

Varijashree is known for her "voice-as-instrument" approach and her fusion of Indian vocal techniques with diverse music traditions. Her collaborations with global icons include Bobby McFerrin, Michael League, Snarky Puppy, Herbie Hancock, Béla Fleck, Victor Wooten, Jacob Collier, and Anoushka Shankar, among others.



Purawai Vyas - Dancer

Purawai Vyas is an emerging dance artist with 20 years of *bharatanatyam* training under Lata Pada at Sampradaya Dance Academy. Holding a BFA in Dance and a BSc in Biomedical Sciences from York University, her multidisciplinary training includes

ballet, contemporary dance, and *kalaripayattu*. Purawai has performed in acclaimed works such as *Svaha!* (2022), *Sankhya* (2022), and *Mandala* (2019), and has presented her own choreography at festivals including Night Shift, Grit Short Dances, and Common Ground. She teaches *bharatanatyam* at Sampradaya Dance Academy.



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

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
