When was the last time we allowed ourselves to dream freely, to imagine a fantastical world, or to embark on a heroic quest? How can we nurture our young ones to have the courage to dream big, explore boundless possibilities, and journey through magical adventures? In a rapidly changing world, it is essential to guide them to grow with curiosity and wonder, encouraging them to imagine and create boldly.

Presented by Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay, the fifth edition of *March On* will be held from 7 - 29 Mar 2025. This annual festival is dedicated to young audiences, celebrating the stories, dreams and experiences that resonate with them. We welcome their families, educators, schools and children's centres to join them in embracing this spirit of imagination and growth. This festival also supports artists in creating meaningful works for children and young audiences.

Inclusion is important to *March On*. For this, we have curated programmes for a variety of age groups aged 0 and up, as well as for audiences from diverse backgrounds. This includes programmes designed with accessibility in mind.

This year, we are thrilled to welcome UK's **Punchdrunk Enrichment** for their first-ever presentation in Singapore and Asia with a special three-week run of *The Lost Lending Library*. Known as masters of immersive theatre, Punchdrunk Enrichment, led by Peter Higgin, brings their groundbreaking storytelling to life for schools, families and different communities. *The*

Lost Lending Library invites audiences to discover a magical world of stories, bringing revellers on a journey which we hope will captivate all who attend.

The festival also supports the presentation of some of the best original and contemporary works for young audiences in Singapore with international collaborations and artistic exchanges. Making their festival debut, Australia's **Terrapin** collaborates with Japan's **Aichi Prefectural Art Theater** in an Esplanade Co-Commission—*Goldfish*. Recommended for ages 8 and up, this visually arresting new work explores humanity's role in times of crisis, transforming simple objects like tarpaulins into oceans and rice sacks into sandbags, evoking powerful imagery. This will be a Relaxed Environment (RE) performance which is perfect for anyone who benefits from a more relaxed setting. No modifications are made to the performance.

Returning to the festival is one of Esplanade's close collaborators, Australia's **Polyglot Theatre** with *Pram People*, a heartfelt celebration of parenthood. This unique experience invites parents with their young ones in prams to reclaim public spaces and promote bonding within the community. As part of the programme, parents and caregivers will don headphones to listen to a specially crafted narrative, creating an immersive and shared experience. We eagerly anticipate the participation from families here as we shape our very own version of *Pram People* in Singapore.

Our local artists are at the heart of *March On*, nurturing creativity and imagination in the next generation through their inspiring work. This year, Esplanade is co-producing *A Drop in the Ocean* with **The Artground**, created and performed by **Ian Loy, Myra Loke, Ellison Tan, and Stan (Serene Tan)**. This work has evolved from Ian's tenure as Esplanade's Associate Artist in 2019 to a full-scale staging at this year's *March On*. Following a warmly received work-in-progress showcase at Sydney Opera House in December 2024, we are excited to bring this tender, sensory experience to Singapore audiences. This is a Relaxed Performance (RP) and specially designed for pre-walking babies, crawlers and early walkers aged 3 to 15 months. The performance is gentle in nature and will be suitable for those who have sensory sensitivities.

We also dive into a new family musical adventure concert, *Biru and the Deep Blue Sea*. Directed by **Adib Kosnan** and music-directed by **Jonathan Shin**, this production will feature the 60-member strong **Singapore National Youth Sinfonia** (housed within the Singapore National Youth Orchestra), showcasing the talents of young musicians aged 10 - 16. This is a Relaxed Environment (RE) performance as well.

The festival's *SEEDLINGS* programme continues to empower young arts enthusiasts aged 7 – 12 through workshops, discussions and public engagements. Additionally, *PLAYlab 2025* offers artists and families the opportunity to experience and contribute to the early stages of new works, fostering a spirit of collaboration and feedback.

As always, this year's lineup also includes an exciting array of free programmes. Among them, *Itchy Fingers 1, 2, 3* by **Some Club** will transform the Esplanade Courtyard into an interactive sculpture garden, blending movement, sound and light into captivating performances.

About Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay

Esplanade is Singapore's national performing arts centre. It hosts a year-round line-up of about 4,000 live performances and activities presented by Esplanade, its partners and hirers. As an arts centre for everyone, Esplanade also creates opportunities for seniors, youth, children and underserved communities to experience the arts. More than 70% of the shows that take place each year at the centre are free for all to enjoy.

Esplanade also brings the arts virtually to audiences in Singapore and beyond, through its diverse range of digital programmes on <u>Esplanade Offstage</u>, an all-access backstage pass to the performing arts and guide to Singapore and Asian arts and culture, with videos, podcasts, articles, quizzes and resources.

The centre works in close partnership with local, regional and international artists to develop artistic capabilities and content, push artistic boundaries and engage audiences. Esplanade supports the creation of artistic content by commissioning and producing new Singapore and Asian work for the international stage. It also develops technical capabilities for the industry nationally.

Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay is operated by The Esplanade Co Ltd (TECL), which is a not-for-profit organisation, a registered Charity and an Institution of a Public Character. TECL received the Charity Governance Award – Special Commendation for Clarity of Strategy in 2016 and 2022, the Charity Transparency Award from 2016 – 2023, and the Charity Transparency Dedication Award in 2024. Esplanade is Singapore's first Dementia-Friendly Arts Venue and a certified Dementia Go-To Point, as well as a guide/assistance dog friendly centre.

A drop falls into the ocean—wondrous and free, with a vast unknown ahead. The still waters are teeming with life: whales call, fishes leap, and new experiences await!

Specially designed for pre-walking babies, crawlers and early walkers aged 3 to 15 months, this immersive, non-verbal, theatrical experience explores the magic and mysteries of the ocean. Through music, sounds and movement, babies will engage in a sensory-rich journey that nurtures their imagination and curiosity.

First developed by Ian Loy in 2019, in collaboration with Ellison Tan, Myra Loke, and Serene Tan (Stan) under Esplanade's Theatre for Young Audiences Associate Artist programme, this work is co-produced by The Artground and Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay.

In December 2024, the production had a work-in-development season at the Sydney Opera House, with six sold-out showcases.

About lan Loy

Ian Loy is a theatre-maker based in Singapore since 1999. He founded MySuperFuture Theatrical Productions in 2009. Through the company, he engages in many community outreach and theatre projects, working with people of all ages and abilities, coaching or creating theatre art, especially for young audiences. He was awarded the Young Artist Award in 2014 for his series of accomplished work in theatre for young audiences (TYA). It is Singapore's highest award for young arts practitioners, aged 35 and below in the year of the award, whose artistic achievements and commitment have distinguished them among their

peers. It encourages him to continue pursuing excellence in the arts, and to look towards inspiring others.

About Ellison Tan

Ellison Tan Yuyang is a Singaporean Chinese performer, playwright and educator. She was an arts leader from 2019 to 2023, co-leading one of Singapore's most prolific theatre companies, The Finger Players. She is also the co-founder of The Wanderlings, Singapore's first collective dedicated to creating Baby Theatre. Ellison's background is in puppetry, playwriting, the Suzuki Method of Actor Training, and Viewpoints.

About Chew Shaw En

Chew Shaw En is a performer, dance artist and facilitator with a multidisciplinary practice that spans various contexts. She works with performance scores, task-based devising, and fundamentally, with improvisation. In spaces where she assumes the role of director and choreographer, she draws upon fantasy, the vernacular, and her experience with socially-engaged arts practices to evoke imagery, metaphor and concepts that guide her creations. Shaw is particularly interested in using rehearsals as an environment to practice new ways of coexistence with a group of people.

About Myra Loke

Myra Loke is a puppeteer, performer, educator, designer and theatre-maker. She started her journey in Singapore theatre 19 years ago. Now, Myra is the General Manager and part of the core team of The Finger Players, one of Singapore's leading theatre companies, best known for their visually arresting productions and its strong advocacy of puppetry. She served as the company's co-Artistic Director from 2020 to 2023.

Myra co-founded an arts collective, The Wanderlings, where she continues her work engaging the neurodiverse community, from ages 0 and up. Myra is also currently working on developing puppetry therapy in Singapore.

About Serene Tan (Stan)

Stan is a versatile musician, sound designer, composer and theatre-maker. Stan's creative endeavours focus on crafting engaging experiences for young audiences and babies. Her work in theatre has been recognised with a nomination for Best Sound at The Straits Times Life Theatre Awards.

As a sound designer and musician, Stan has pioneered live music experiences for young audiences, collaborating with directors to craft a new aural language in productions such as Esplanade's *PLAYtime!* series. Her work has taken her to global stages including the Yogjakarta Gamelan Festival, Brave Festival in Poland and the Shanghai Glass Museum.

About Singapore National Youth Sinfonia

The Singapore National Youth Sinfonia (SNYS) was formed from the rich heritage of the Singapore National Youth Orchestra (SNYO). Under the guidance of the Singapore Symphony Group (SSG), the orchestra was transformed, and the ensemble emerged as the Youth Sinfonia in 2016.

The SNYS consists of over 90 members aged 10 to 16 from more than 40 schools across Singapore, guided by professional musicians in rehearsals, sectionals, and masterclasses. Recognised by the Ministry of Education as a National Project of Excellence, members of the SNYO have their participation in the orchestra recognised as a Co-Curricular Activity and is led by SNYO's Associate Conductor, Mr Seow Yibin.

The SNYS actively engages in educational outreach initiatives to inspire the next generation of musicians through outreach concerts and is dedicated to nurturing the next generation of musical talent, providing aspiring young musicians with a platform to hone their skills and express their creativity.

About Adib Kosnan

Adib Kosnan is a theatre practitioner and educator passionate about creating platforms for communication and care through theatre. Since 2017, Adib has been an associate artist with Checkpoint Theatre. He was named Best Supporting Actor at The Straits Times Life Theatre Awards 2020 for his role in *Angkat*. His directing credits include *Tanah*Air* by Drama Box (co-director with Kok Heng Leun, 2019) and *The Story of Batu Bulat* (2023).

He also wrote and acted in *Keluarga Besar En. Karim* (2021) by Checkpoint Theatre. Adib was the co-lead artist for *Both Sides Now: Mengukir Harapan* (2020 - 2022), an arts experience focusing on end-of-life issues in the Malay Muslim community. Adib engages in Forum theatre regularly and has devised and conceptualised interactive programmes with students ranging from pre-school to tertiary levels.

In 2023, Adib was awarded the NAC scholarship to pursue his Masters in Arts Pedagogy and Practice at LASALLE College of the Arts.

About Jonathan Shin

Jonathan Shin is a Singaporean composer-pianist who performs extensively as a soloist and chamber musician, and improvises across multiple genres. He has won prizes for his piano performances in North American and European competitions, as well as awards in all age categories of the locally-based National Piano and Violin Competition.

Shin's music has been described as "supremely confident and comfortable in its own skin" by The Straits Times. His first commission, *The Other Merlion and Friends*, was critically reviewed as "probably the most compelling and worthwhile new work from any Singaporean composer in recent years." In 2020, his concert overture *City Arising* was premiered by the Singapore Symphony Orchestra for its annual National Day concert.

Shin's works have been premiered and performed in Europe, Asia and North America. He is a founding member of the Lorong Boys, a multi-genre group.
