

# Make a Hornbill Mask

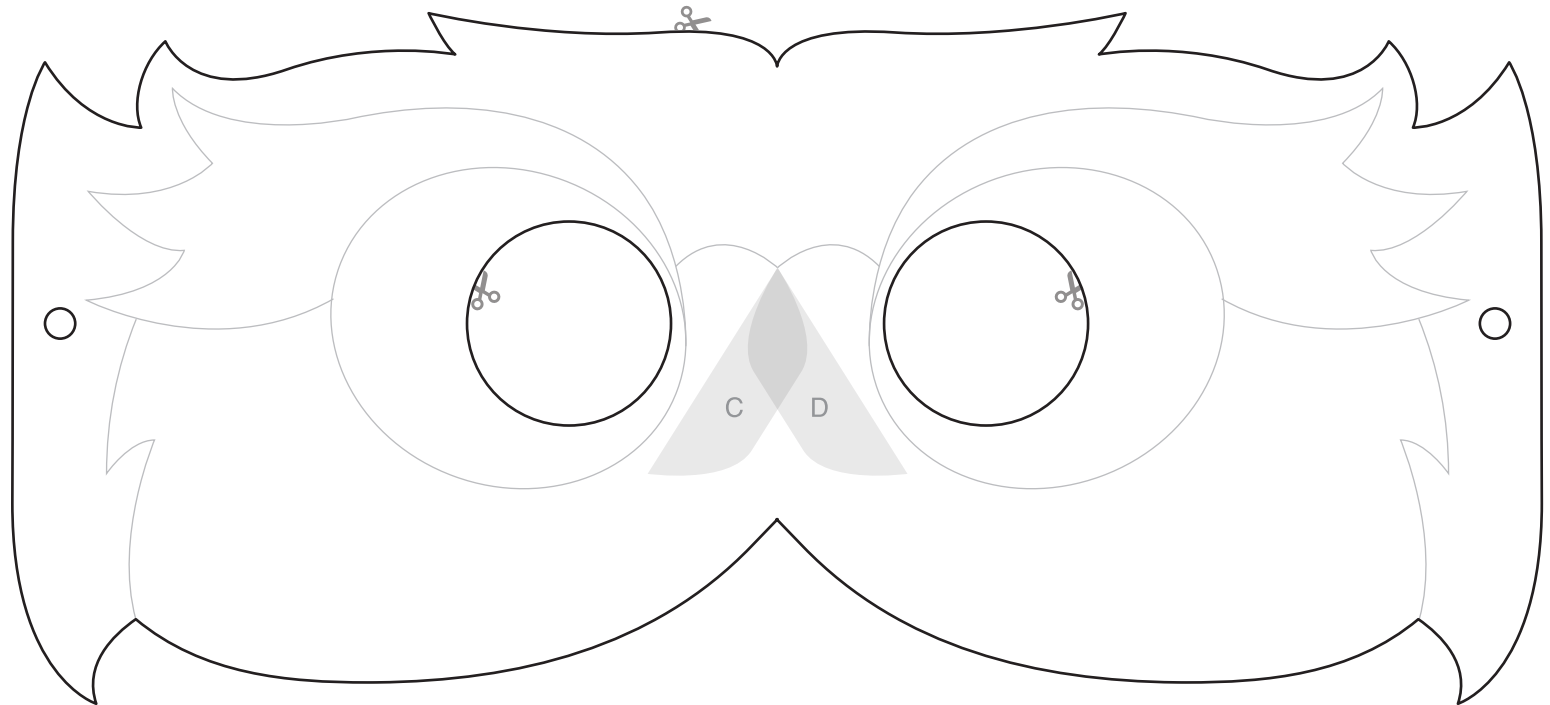
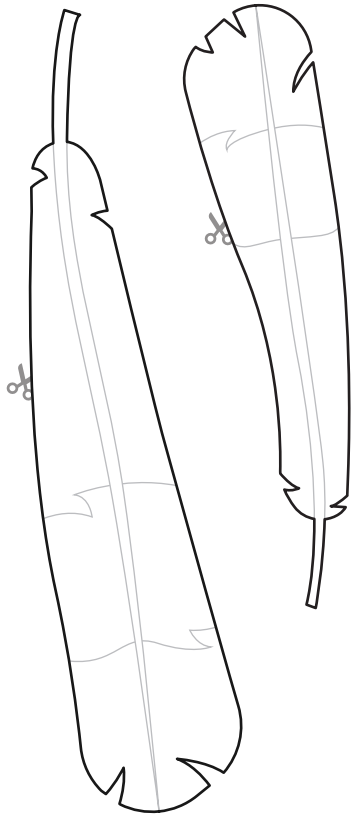

Make a mask of a hornbill and act out a scene from the story with a friend or a family member.

## Did you know?

Three species of hornbills are believed to be native to Singapore—the Oriental Pied Hornbill, Rhinoceros Hornbill and Helmeted Hornbill. However, only the Oriental Pied Hornbill, remains in Singapore.

Front of mask

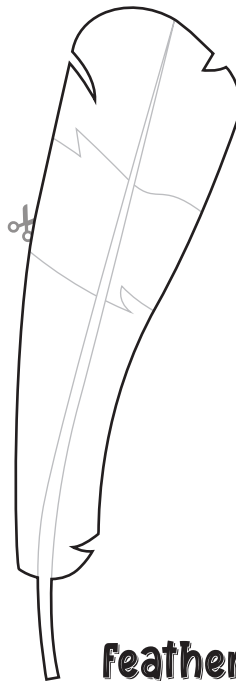
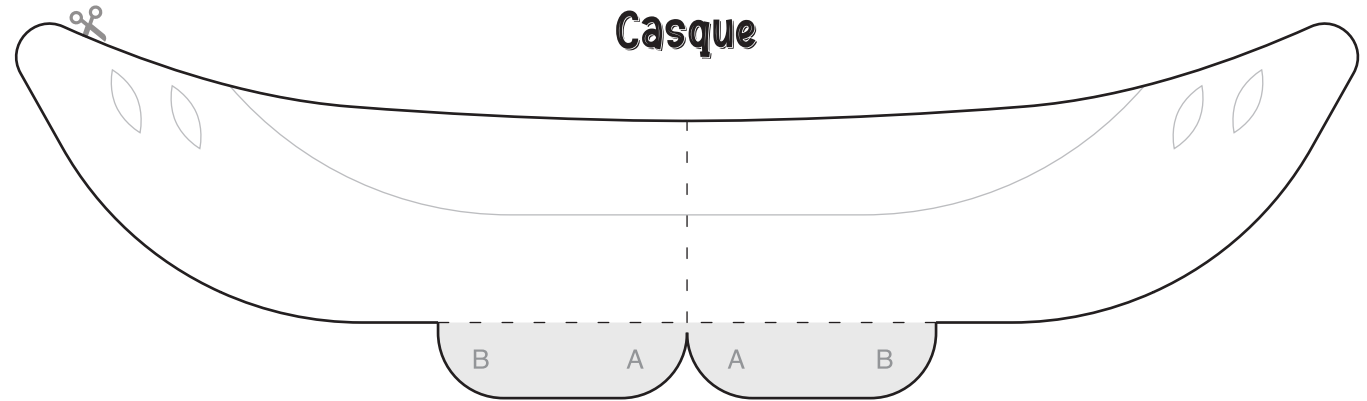
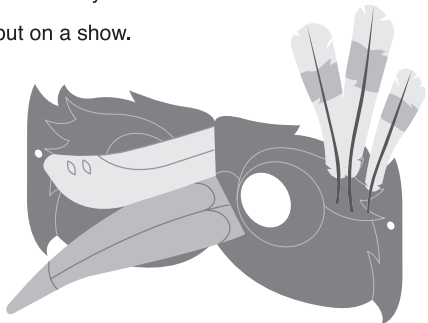
## Get these ready:

- 1 Printer
- 2 Colouring material
- 3 Scissors
- 4 Double sided tape or glue
- 5 Elastic band/rubber band/ribbon

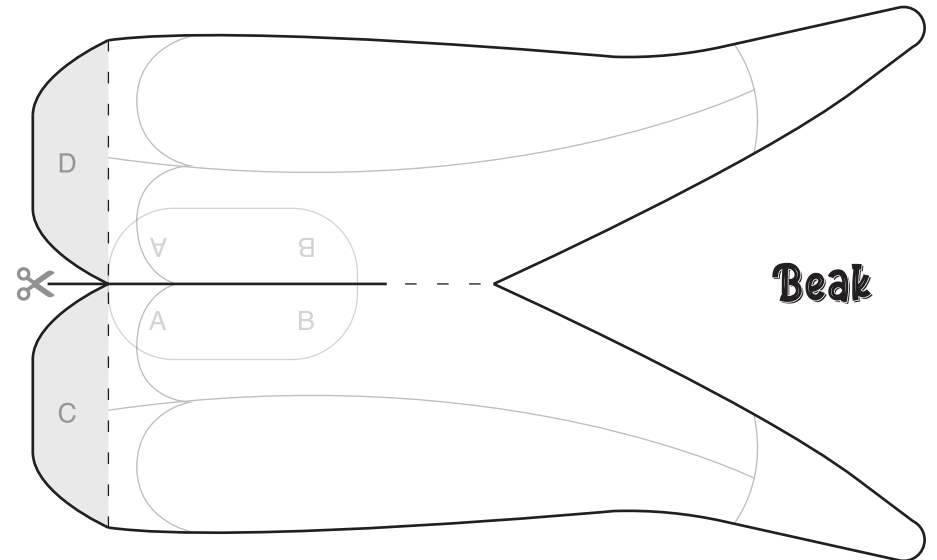
## Here's what you need to do:

- 1 Print out the template.
- 2 Colour in your mask.
- 3 Cut out the different parts of the mask.  
Don't forget to cut out the eye holes too.
- 4 Fold the beak along the dotted line.
- 5 Stick or glue the flaps on the beak (C & D) onto the front of the mask (C & D). Your beak should point downwards.
- 6 Stick or glue the flap on the casque to the top of the beak (A & B). Your casque should point upwards.
- 7 Glue the feathers to the mask.
- 8 Use a sharp pencil to make two holes at the side of the mask.
- 9 Loop the band or ribbon through the holes. Tie a knot.  
If you are using elastic/rubber bands, you can loop them around your ears. If you are using a ribbon, you can tie it to the back of your head.
- 10 That's it! Time to put on a show.
