

MAKE YOUR OWN AWANG BATIL MASK

Did you know? The *awang batil* (storyteller) uses two masks, the Hulubalang mask and the Wak Nujum mask, when suitable characters appear in the stories to attract the audience's attention.

Let's try them out below!

You'll need:

1. Scissors
2. Colour pencils or markers
3. Paper hole puncher
4. Ribbon or string

Instructions:

- 1** Use colour pencils or markers to colour in the mask.
- 2** Carefully cut along the outline of the mask.
- 3** Use a hole puncher to punch a hole on each side of the mask where the dotted lines are.
- 4** Tie a long ribbon through each hole.
- 5** Wear the mask by tying the ends of the ribbon at the back of your head!
